# Lukens and McNamee win \$2,000 research grants

Nancy Lukens, professor of German and women's studies, was awarded a \$2,000 grant to spend a part of summer 2006 in Germany and Switzerland. As noted in her recent travel report, Lukens first delivered a lecture and lead a discussion relating the life and thought of Dietrich Bonhoeffer to that of his contemporary Adam von Trott, both executed for their roles in the attempt to overthrow Hitler's regime.
