### STATEMENT.

You will see by the report of the Selectmen of 1883, there was reported in the hands of the Collector for the years 1877 & 8, the sum of \$284 90. By an examination of the Treasurer's book, we find that Frank George, Treasurer of the town, credited the Collector for the years named, with the sum of \$99 30 and settled with the next Treasurer for the same, and he accounted for that sum. It appears that the Treasurer's book is correct, and the Selectmen should have reported in the hands of the Collector for 1877 & 8, \$185 60.

Said Collector paid into the Treasury in March last, \$80 00; leaving the balance now in his hands \$105 60 as by our report. We also find that the Selectmen in their settlement with B. D. Eastman, Collector for 1882, charged him with \$211 46 in his hands, also sales of Resident estate, amounting to \$122 05; total, \$333 45. We find by an examination, that the Collector should have been charged with \$220 68, including sales, and no more; making a difference of \$112 78.
