The board of Education submit the following report for the year ending March 1, 1893 :

Whole number of children between the ages of five and fifteen years, as enumerated by the selectmen, April 1, 1892, 95 ; boys, 58 ; girls, 37. Whole number of scholars five years of age and upwards who have attended school in town, 124.

In reviewing the work of our schools for another year, we feel that we can sincerely congratulate you upon the success that has attended our efforts ; and for the good condition of our several schools, with the exception of some breaks occasioned by sickness, the schools have been uninterrupted. Our teachers have been workers, and it has been a pleasure to behold the order and industry manifested by the scholars in our calls upon schools. We have been pleased in looking over the registers to see the long list of the names of visitors. It is

helpful as well as encouraging, and pleasant to the teachers and scholars to see such interest manifest. There has been a decided advance in this direction in the past year. We would urge upon the parents the importance of prompt attendance of their children all of the school year.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Brentwood qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a moderator.
2. To choose three selectmen, town treasurer and clerk.
3. To choose a collector of taxes, and all other necessary town officers and agents, for the year ensuing.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools ; for paying the town debts and defraying the interest thereon, and for other necessary charges arising in said town ; for laying out and repairing highways and sidewalks, and building and repairing bridges ; for the maintenance of the poor ; for schoolhouses ; and to establish and maintain public libraries, cemeteries, and parks or commons, and to improve the same ; to prepare and publish the early history of the town.
5. To hear the reports of the town treasurer and board of selectmen to the town auditors ; the reports of the auditors, agents, committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the public statutes relating to free public libraries, and to raise and appropriate the sum required by law therefor, and elect trustees for such free public library.

7. To transact all other business which may come before said meeting.
