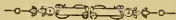

State of New Hampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookline qualified to vote in Town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at Tucker's Hall, in said Town, on the Second Tuesday of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of the Poor; paying the just debts of the Town and all other legal purposes the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of schools the year ensuing.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the repair of roads and bridges the ensuing year, and say how the same shall be raised and appropriated.

Article 5. To see what sum the Town will raise to meet the necessary expenses of the Brookline Public Library, or act in any way in relation to the same.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the purchase of Text Books and other supplies, in compliance with Chapter 13, Laws of 1889.

Article 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to observing Memorial Day; raise or appropriate money therefor, or act anything relative thereto.

Article 8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to improving the Common and repairing the Town House thereon; raise or appropriate money therefor, or do anything relative thereto.

Article 9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Legacy of Miss Caroline A. Brooks, late of Townsend, Mass.

Article 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell all, or any part of the land belonging to the Town, on the north side of the railroad, leading from Main street to Depot and known as the Cox land.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to build a sidewalk leading from the Common to the railroad near the Pond bridge.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to build a Receiving tomb and raise money for the same.

Article 13. To see if the Town will exempt from taxation for a term of years any Manufacturing firm or company, that by such vote can be encouraged to locate here.

Article 14. To hear the reports of Agents, Anditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen, and act thereon.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

In presenting this our annual Report, we have to say, that with the exception of more or less sickness among the scholars, all the schools are in a prosperous condition.

The same teachers of a year ago were continued the past year, and each and all labored faithfully for the advancement of the scholars under their charge.

During the past year the North and West houses were newly furnished, adding much to the comfort and happiness of pupils and teachers, and certainly to the credit and good name of our town.

The North school house needs shingling, and your Board would recommend that a coat of paint be given the outside of each house, as a matter of economy as well as appearance. Perhaps the best course to pursue as to keeping the outside of the houses in repair, would be to raise a certain amount annually for repairing roofs and outside painting.

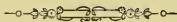
