# Town Warrant, 1925.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

ART. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- Section A Town Officers' Salaries.  
B Town Officers' expenses.  
C Election and Registration.  
D Town Hall and office expenses.  
E Police department.  
F Fire department including forest fires.  
G Health department.  
H Vital Statistics.  
I Trunk line maintenance, Town proportion.  
J Town maintence, including general highways, permanent improvement by law, lighting, waetr and general expense.  
K Libraries, in addition to the amount required by law, amount required by law, \$110.  
L Town poor.  
M Memorial service.  
N Interest.  
O Breaking roads and snowing bridges.  
P Repairs on Smith bridge.  
Q Payment on town debt.  
R State Tax.  
S County Tax.

ART. 3 To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.

ART. 4 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the town, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), if needed.

ART. 5 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to obtain State Aid for the permanent improvement of its highways, as provided by law.

ART. 6 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

ART. 7 To see what action the town will take in regard to a piece of land in Conway Village deeded to the town by James Willey and now claimed to be owned by Mark Head.

ART. 8 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money and expend the same for the ex-

tension of the present street sewer line on Chase Avenue in Conway Village, three hundred seventy-five (375) feet easterly along the southerly side of said avenue, installing three (3) catch basins, to said extension, at points designated by the selectmen of said Conway.

ART. 9 To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to enter into a contract with the Eastman Company under which the Company may be privileged to connect with Conway village street drainage system on the southerly side of Chase avenue in said town for the purpose of carrying off its waste water from its can washing platform and charging for such service such consideration in payment therefore as said selectmen may deem sufficient.

ART. 10 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money for the observance of Old Home Day in the Town of Conway, and a committee to be appointed by the moderator to arrange for the same.

ART. 11 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to be used for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

ART. 12 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to tarvia the roads from Conway Center near the cemetery to Mill Brook Bridge and from the Perkins' homestead to the Fryeburg line, also to maintain all the present tarvia roads, and to hire a sufficient sum of money upon the credit of the town to pay for the same, agreeable to the suggestion of the Budget Committee.

ART. 13 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tarvia Mechanic street, so called, in North Conway from Kearsarge Road to Main street, agreeable to a petition signed by Clara M. Eastman and others,

ART. 14 To see if the town will vote to use the unexpended balance left from from the building of Mill street in Center Conway towards tarvia for said Mill street during the present year and raise and appropriate in addition a sufficient sum of money to tarvia said street from Main street to Mill Bridge at the outlet of Conway Lake, agreeable to a petition signed by W. R. Burnell and others.

ART. 15 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tarvia Seavey Street in North Conway village from its intersection with Main Street to its intersection with Kearsarge Street, agreeable to a peti-

tion signed by B. J. Callan and others.

ART. 16 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to install a drain for the street between the Congregational Church and Charles Gibson's residence to be placed on the east side of the street, also to install one in front of the Valley Inn, and one in front of Earl Merrill's residence, and one between Amos Thompsons' and Elmer Downs' residence, all on the west side of Main street, agreeable to a petition signed by E. S. Thompson and others.

ART. 17 To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to run lines and determine the bounds of highways leading from house of Charles E. Cook in South Conway by the School house to junction at Four Corners near residence of George Grames, agreeable to a petition signed by Chas E. Cook and others.

ART. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) dollars to rebuild the road across Carlton Meadow, so called, beginning at a point where the permanent highway ends. Also to see what action the town will take to eliminate the dangerous curve at the foot of Ivy Hill so called, agreeable to a petition signed by A. Ernest Davidson and others.

ART. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000) dollars and to use the same for highway improvement on the road in "The Stark Neighborhood" so called, running from the four corner's school house, so called, to the main road leading from Conway Corner to Center Conway, in said town, agreeable to a petition signed by Charles Ham and others.

ART. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-five Hundred (\$2,500) dollars to reconstruct the highway in East Conway, known as Intervale Road, from the Fryeburg, Maine, line to the watering trough, agreeable to a petition signed by E. L. Webster and others.

ART. 21. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

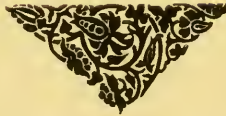

## CONWAY PUBLIC LIBRARY

To the Board of Trustees:

I have the pleasure of presenting my report for the year ending December 31, 1924.

In some respects it has been a most successful year. There has been a ten per cent increase in circulation, a larger reading room attendance and additions to the number of active borrowers.

Owing to lack of funds, there have been no accessions by purchase other than through the Duplicate Pay System, which applies only to fiction, in consequence of which the non-fiction and juvenile departments have suffered. However, we have been most fortunate in the matter of gifts, having received about seventy-five (75) volumes from Mrs. Strangman, six (6) each from Miss Valentine and Mrs. Arthur Potter several from Ira D. and Lennan Glackens, and one each from a number of the young people of this village.

The North Conway Public Library having taken an inventory, having found itself the possessor of many duplicates, very generously turned over fifty (50) volumes to us, all non-fiction, and already proving their usefulness.

It is recommended that, if possible, the annual appropriation be sufficiently increased to make possible the purchase of books for the American History and Science departments that they may be made adequate for the High School needs.

I have the honor and pleasure of submitting this, my seventh annual report, of the work and condition of your schools. The year has been satisfactory, and a constant growth in educational ideals is noted. The teachers have all had special preparation for their work. There are five college graduates, and sixteen graduates of normal schools now teaching in your schools.

## ATTENDANCE AND TRUANCY

The schools have not been broken up so much because of contagious diseases as they were last year. But too many cases of absences are found on the record book. From September until the 11th of February there were 714 days lost in North Conway, and 1514½ days in the Conway grades. This means that the school work is broken up and the work of the schools hampered. No one has been appointed and qualified for truant officer.



## GRADUATION AT KENNETT

The first graduation of Kennett High School took place last June, and 26 pupils received the regular diplomas of the school, and three pupils received post graduate diplomas. Of the graduates of the school, three entered N. H. University, one went to Dartmouth College, one to Worcester Polytechnic, and five entered normal or training schools.

The present Senior class numbers 25, with 10 post graduates. I recommend that a special course of study be provided for the post graduate pupils, as some of the courses now taken, have been taken before, and the pupils do not show the interest in an old subject they would in something new and fresh.

The following is a list of the High Honor students for the fall term of 1924: Richard Park, Bessie Ham, Elizabeth Hounsel, Madeline Lord, Dryden Snow, Ruth Towle, David Kellam, Hazel Kellam, Laura Chase, Ruth Garnet, Doris Perkins, Gordon Potter. All of these pupils have maintained a rank of 90% or above.

The Commercial subjects are favored by the pupils, as Typewriting has 57, the two classes in Book-keeping number 61; Shorthand has 12; the French classes number 68; Latin, 35; Chemistry, 34; and Physics, 14. Household Arts does not attract a large number, as only five girls are taking this subject. Cooking and Sewing has ten, and Household Management, 5.

## GIFTS

The schools of Conway have been the recipient of many gifts. Mrs. Helen Merriman has been sending the elementary schools of the district two papers de-

voted to teaching kindness to animals, and these papers are highly appreciated and no doubt have great influence in kindling a love for and appreciation of our animal friends. The former students of Kearsarge presented a noble picture of the statue of Abraham Lincoln. The silent influence of this picture will, no doubt, be reflected in the characters of the pupils of this school. Mrs. James D. Hunting has shown her interest in the schools by contributing substantial cash prizes for excellence in school work, and she has lately contributed framed pictures of the athletic teams, to be hung in Kennett High School. The North Conway Library Association recently gave several hundred volumes of standard books for the use of the High School. The books were much needed, and will be greatly appreciated by both teachers and pupils.

### REPAIRS

The Conway, Redstone and West Side houses have been painted during the year. The North Conway and Kearsarge houses should be painted during the year. Some new furniture should be purchased as some of the desks are in a bad shape, and should be replaced with new ones. I wish again to call your attention to the fact that the North Conway school house has no system of ventilation. It is quite as bad to breathe dirty air as it would be to drink dirty water.

I thank you all for your helpful suggestions and loyal support.
