# Warrant for Town Meeting

---

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Public Library.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for state aid construction for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for state aid maintenance for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for trunk line maintenance for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to shingle the town hall and appropriate money for same.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to build a balcony in town hall and appropriate money for same.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to have a Trial Justice appointed.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote toward building a cement sidewalk.
