

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 1, 1891.

Five schools have been maintained in town the past year, and teachers retained in each school but one, and that one was no fault of the teacher. There have been a few cases of complaint, but if parents would co-operate with teachers, there would be less cause for criticism. Our teachers have worked hard and faithfully in their school duties.

There have been 110 different scholars enrolled in town with an average attendance of 82.

The Vessel Rock school house has been newly shingled on one side; newly clapboarded on one side and end, and patched where needed; new door and frame; painted outside and in, and newly plastered where the old was loose, making a neat, attractive school-room which is appreciated by teacher and pupils.
