

WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3rd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To hear the report of Auditors and the School Board of the Town School District.
- 6th. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to pay its firemen by the hour, in addition to their regular pay, when called out to attend fires, and, if so, how much.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to pay the Band one hundred dollars in consideration of giving out of door concerts during the warm season, or act thereon.
- 10th. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed of land near the Iron bridge, given the town by Frank G. Hough and wife.

11th. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to re-place the bill boards upon the outside of the Town House, or permit the same to be done, or act thereon.

12th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money, not exceeding five hundred dollars, for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

VILLAGE CEMETERY COMMITTEE.

When the Village Cemetery was placed in the hands of the Committee last spring they found it in very bad shape. Piles of rubbish had been allowed to accumulate for years on the bank and about the hearse house ; brush had grown up around the fence and through the cemetery, quite a number of headstones had fallen down and many others were leaning.

The cemetery was given a pretty thorough cleaning in the spring, the brush on the bank and through the cemetery was cut, over one hundred stones were reset in brimstone, many others through the cemetery were straightened up and several new sockets were cut for headstones.

A part of the cemetery bordering on School street was graded, quite a number of loads of loam were carted in, the headstones were straightened up and put on a line; the hearse house was raised about fifteen inches, a new sill was put in on one side, new doors were hung, and the building was given two coats of whitewash ; the weeds and grass were cut out of the roads and their edges trimmed and nearly all the evergreen trees were trimmed. A set of adjustable racks for lining graves, a lawn mower, a wheelbarrow and other tools were purchased.

The amount expended by the town was \$128.71, from special appropriation, for which the Selectmen hold vouchers; \$18.00 from the Eldridge Fund; and \$8.00 from the Selectmen for grass cutting.

In conclusion the Committee would say that there should be expended two or three hundred dollars more to put the cemetery in good shape and then a comparatively small sum, in addition to the amounts received from the Eldridge Fund and for the care of lots, will keep it in good shape.

GLENWOOD CEMETERY COMMITTEE.

Glenwood Cemetery was purchased in 1873 and from that time until 1890 almost nothing was expended for improvements. In that year the amount received for the sale of lots was voted for the improvement of the cemetery.

The cemetery contains about twenty acres of land and the committee found it difficult to know what to do with the small amount at their disposal. They expended \$158.09 in cutting brush and grading road leading to the cemetery.

In 1891 they expended \$137.45 in fences, blasting and improvements.

In 1892 a building was erected for a tool house and shelter for teams, etc.; about eighty rods of fence were built and other improvements made, at an expense of \$433.68.

In 1893, owing to a call from the lot owners, the precinct water was brought into the cemetery, a two-inch pipe was laid to the top of the hill, a distance of about 650 feet and about 750 feet of 1½-inch pipe to the circle near the center of the cemetery, and other improvements made, at an expense of \$498.49.

In 1894 it was thought best to put the work in charge of one man under direction of the committee. Mr. Geo.

H. Williams was engaged and was constantly employed from April to December, in this and the Village cemetery, doing the work to the satisfaction of the committee and, as we believe, of the lot owners.

It has been the aim of the committee to have more uniformity in the grade of the lots as a rule was adopted that no lot should be raised higher than six inches, and in all grading done under their direction, batter boards were used that the surfaces might be even.

The water pipes were extended, five street washers were set for watering lots and three fountains were purchased, partly by subscription.

Two small parks were graded for flower gardens and the circle near the center was also graded.

There was a small piece of land purchased of F. B. Kendrick for the purpose of straightening the fence.

Quite a tract in the westerly part of the cemetery was ploughed and partly graded; a part of the ground near the tomb was drained with tile pipe; quite a number of the boulders near the tool house were blasted out.

About May 1st an increase of from \$1.00 to \$5.00 was made in the price of lots.

In conclusion the committee recommend that as far as possible those owning lots should make provision for their care, in sums of not less than \$200.00, that a perpetual care fund may be established.

It is hoped that the town will vote a small appropriation for this and the other cemeteries of the town as the fund now at the disposal of the committee is small and it will be necessary to build quite an amount of fence another year and new avenues should be opened and graded.

The amount received from the fund will be found in the Selectmen's report.

 THE BOARD OF HEALTH
 FOR THE YEAR 1894.

During the year there have been sixteen cases of typhoid fever, of which five proved fatal; six cases of scarlet fever, none of which were fatal; five cases of diphtheria, three of which were fatal.

Great care has been taken to have the dwellings quarantined as soon as the Board were notified of the existence of any contagious disease, and the premises properly fumigated as soon as quarantine was removed.

During the year six farms have been visited and the herds of cattle belonging there have been inspected on account of tuberculosis, and to prevent the sale of milk from a herd thus infected. These inspections resulted in receiving orders from the State Board to have five animals killed, and as far as known has stopped the spread of the disease in town.

There were seventy-seven deaths in town during the past year, from the following diseases: Fractured spine, 1; tonsillitis, 1; pleurisy fever, 1; softening of the brain, 1; bronchitis, 1; meningitis, 1; stricture, 1; cardiac dyspnoea, 1; strangulated hernia, 1; malformation, 1; acute melancholia, 1; chorea with delirium, 1; inflammation of bowels, 1; cerebro spinal scerosis, 1; convulsions, 2; influenza, 2;

paralysis, 3; diphtheria, 3; grip, 3; pneumonia, 4; consumption, 4; cancer, 4; senility, 4; typhoid fever, 5; peritonitis, 6; disease of the heart, 6; apoplexy, 6; cholera infantum, 7; suppression of urine, 1. There was one drowned and two killed by accident.

Quite a number of complaints have been made in regard to the unsanitary condition of dwellings in the village. These have been attended to and remedied as far as possible by the Board.

TOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT.

In presenting our annual report we are pleased to say that the schools this year have in most cases been very successful, and good work has been done. The schools have not been broken up by sickness, as has sometimes been the case, and we feel that this has been an unusually successful year.

The district has been very liberal in voting money for school purposes, and in order to have good schools we find it necessary to hire the best teachers, and such always command a good price.

It is a difficult matter to give all equal school privileges, as a teacher for four or five scholars takes an undue proportion of the money, and to carry them costs almost as much. We think the parents ought to be willing to bear part of the expense.

A yet more urgent need is the hearty cooperation of the parents with the teachers. Too frequently this is not given. Parents cannot take too deep an interest in the welfare of the schools, for in them, to a great degree, are laid the foundations of the mental, moral and physical character of their children.

We wish to bring to the attention of the district the demand for more room for the scholars in the Townsend or Brickyard school.

The same amount as raised last year will be necessary for school purposes, to keep our schools up to the present standard, and not cut down the length of the school year.
