4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

5. To see what action the town will take regarding additions to our street lighting system.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Civilian Defense.

7. To see what action the town will take regarding the improvement of the South Merrimack cemetery.

8. To see what action the town will take regarding the establishing of a municipal court.

9. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount for the early payment of taxes.

10. To see what action the town will take regarding hydrants.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

1. During 1950 Tinker road and Wilson Hill road were completed and surfaced with State Aid and town funds. The finishing of these two roads marks the completion of a three year road improvement project.

2. A new fence has been erected at the Thornton's Ferry cemetery. This was a project accomplished by Thornton Grange with the town furnishing the materials.

3. A Civilian Defense director, Dr. George S. Baldry was appointed in December, under whose direction a Civilian Defense program has been established in conjunction with the State Defense director. Some consideration should be given to the desirability of making an appropriation for this work in 1951.

4. During 1950 the Selectmen expended \$300.00 for legal services of Upton & Upton of Concord, N. H. in representing the town at a hearing before the Public Service Commission in an attempt to prevent the Boston & Maine R. R. from discontinuing its agency at Merrimack. After the hearing the Public Service Commission ruled that the railroad must continue to operate the Merrimack agency. The Selectmen felt that the railroad agency was of vital importance to our industries.

5. A new combination tank truck and pumper was purchased for the Fire Department out of the town's surplus at a cost of \$5519.00.

6. One coat of lead and oil has been applied to the Town Hall and the second coat will be applied in the spring. This project was voted last year to be paid for out of the surplus.

7. The Police were authorized by the Selectmen to purchase a two way radio for use by the department. This radio is part of the Nashua Police network. The expenditure for this item was \$400.00 and came out of the Police Department's appropriation.

8. Two additional street lights have been installed in Thornton's Ferry and South Merrimack.

May we suggest in case of fire, call the fire department; after that do everything you can to put the fire out, keep buildings closed as much as possible.

When the department arrives tell them where water is available, where the main switch is located, where the oil tank is placed. Tell them where the stairs are, hallways and passageways and any other information that will give them a working knowledge as to construction of the building.

FOREST FIRES — OUR MOST SHAMEFUL WASTE

Everyone apparently fears fire but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public — YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

1. Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
2. Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
3. Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
4. Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to continue the preparation of the site of the new High School.
10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to provide a cost of living bonus for the teachers, said sum to be made immediately available to the district.
11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to help equip the cafeteria.
12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Merrimack School District:

I herewith submit my second annual report on the condition of your schools.

The past year has been highlighted by the following developments: 1) Completion of the new high school building, 2) An attempt to improve the transportation system, 3) A continuing increase in school population and 4) Retention of our most able teachers and hiring excellent replacements.

Although to many the erection of the building has seemed a slow process, we can well feel pleased that it is now finished and at a reasonable price. Many school districts have had much longer delays than we have, and in the meantime prices have advanced at least 15%. Today we would have a very difficult task letting a contract for such a building.

An attempt was made to improve the bus situation by sending one large bus up the old Amherst Road. Whereas this move has affected some saving, it has also made it necessary for some pupils to leave home much earlier and arrive home much later than before. The increased school population along the D. W. Highway has been partly responsible for this, making it necessary to make two trips. I feel we should continue to study this problem to see what can be done to relieve the situation even more.

The increasing school population has continued its upward trend causing serious overcrowding in grades 3 and 4. Next year we can expect large enrollments in grades 3, 4 and 5. Although our two teachers have been very patient and have made the best of the situation, some thought should be given to alleviating this situation next year. Forty pupils or more per room is neither fair to pupils nor the teachers.

The turnover of teachers was the smallest it has been for several years. Retaining good teachers helps to improve the instruction about as much as any other single factor. Our old and new teachers have been very conscientious and have done the best job possible under conditions that existed.

The effects of the present crisis in world affairs will not be felt as much in the elementary grades as in the high schools and colleges. However, even the elementary schools will have to make some adjustments. There is bound to be shortages in certain school supplies and possibly even text books. The cost of these items can be expected to increase.

The biggest single effect can be expected in the form of a shortage of teachers even more critical than any we have yet seen. Every school district should carefully consider the part that salaries play in keeping and obtaining able teachers.

The fine cooperation of the school board, teachers and parents has made this year an enjoyable one. It is only through such cooperation that our schools can continue to improve.
