#### THE TOWN WARRANT

## The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon (polls close at 6 p. m.), to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for interest on same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for Recreation as asked by the Recreation Committee.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$925.00 for the care of Cemeteries.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$561.40 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$3,742.69.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4.000.00 in addition to the joint T. R. A. fund.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take relative to the compensation of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Town Clerk, and Auditors for this and future years.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for the Concord Hospital. (Not recommended by Budget Committee.)
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the Town.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to acquire land at Northwood Lake, namely, Lots No. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 in North Shore Park in the Town of Northwood and to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to take Lots No. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 in North Shore Park within the municipal limits, in fee by gift, purchase, or right of eminent domain for the purpose of public recreation activities in accordance with the provisions of the New Hampshire Statutes annotated 31:44.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to create a zoning commission or planning board to recommend to the next annual Town Meeting a zoning ordinance under the provisions of R. S. A. 31:60 and R. S. A. 36:1-10 and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a commission of five members one of whom shall be a Selectman.

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the State Highway Department rate of pay for trucks and equipment hired for summer and winter maintenance in the Town of Northwood.
- 16. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.



- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to

### REPORT OF PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

Since my last annual report a full year in the new elementary school has been completed, and we are well into the last half of the second year.

The basic purpose of elementary schooling is to provide the child with the fundamentals and teach the skills necessary for learning in the years ahead.

The many other activities that go hand in hand, and implement regular learning are also a necessary part of the learning process. Music, one of the extra activities, I consider to be a vital part of education. James Martell, our music supervisor, has done an outstanding job in Northwood over the past few years. This year promises to be a banner year. We formed a glee club late last year. The performance given at graduation was outstanding. This year we have organized a junior glee club, a minor league, that will develop young singers for the senior glee club.

Mr. Martell has performed miracles with the school band, and this year the band took second honors in the general class at Rochester Fair. A major event will take place at the school this spring. Details for the Music Festival are in the process of being worked out.

Last year's talent show provided money for the purchase of hats for the band and additional material for capes. Great successes appear in the future of our music department.

Another proud addition to our school is the new stage curtain and drapes in the auditorium. The material was purchased from the proceeds of the mothers and daughters, fathers and sons basketball games, and from the proceeds of our "name" band, Carl's Cavaliers, dance sponsored by the eighth grade.

The mothers held two work bees and sewed the material into our beautiful curtain and drapes.

Last year's eighth grade produced and staged two one act plays that packed the auditorium with proud parents and friends.

Another first for Northwood Elementary School was our Science Fair. The reception of this science fair and art exhibit by the people of Northwood far surpassed our greatest hopes.

The fair boasted exhibits from grades one through eight and every child in the school was represented. This successful event could only have happened with the complete and sincere cooperation of all the teachers. This year's fair is tentatively scheduled for May.

An active organization in the Northwood School has been the P.T.A. The school has benefitted both educationally and materially through the efforts of this dedicated group. This year the P.T.A. donated and had installed a new six-seat swing set, and recently purchased a new TV for classroom use. Support for the P.T.A. pays off in many ways. The P.T.A. deserves the support of all the people of Northwood.

The success or failure of a school system rarely hinges on one person. It is only through the work of the teachers, and the support of the townspeople that we can successfully operate the school. I gratefully acknowledge, and sincerely appreciate, the cooperation and help rendered me by the teachers and citizens of Northwood.

#### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools:

In the following report I have attempted to clarify the duties of the school nurse, and to explain briefly the school health program.

My schedule must of necessity be a flexible one. However, it allows for at least one visit per week to each of the schools in the area, and a second weekly visit is frequently made to each of the two largest schools — Barrington and Epsom. The schedule is set up in this manner:

Barrington — Monday.

When a second visit seems necessary it is made on Thursday afternoon.

Epsom — Friday.

A second visit to this school would be made on Tuesday afternoon.

Northwood — Wednesday.

Nottingham — Tuesday.

Strafford — Thursday.

Changes are made as needed to accommodate the immediate needs of any particular school; in which case, the principal of the school scheduled for a visit is notified. This makes it possible, in the event of an emergency, for the nurse to be located by any of the schools without undue delay.

All pupils are examined as soon after the start of the school year as possible. Height, weight, teeth, tonsils and eyes are checked then. The hearing test may also be given at this time or be done in the spring. Inspection of hair and scalp is done at least twice yearly.

Notices of defects are sent home, and these children

again checked at a later date to determine the number of corrections which have been made. When recourse to the health resources of the state seems advisable, referrals may be made by the school nurse, and she provides application forms.

First-aid at the school is given by the nurse if she is present. Otherwise it is given by the teacher and later checked by the nurse if this appears to be warranted. Also, any child showing symptoms of illness or disease is seen by the nurse if possible. The parents are notified of the child's condition, and it is their responsibility to provide transportation home; although under certain circumstances the nurse may see fit to take the child home.

Home visits are made, either in response to a request by the parents, or when it is felt that a personal discussion with the parents might be of benefit to all concerned. As of December 31, 1962, a total of 101 home calls had been made.

I have been very graciously received by the parents, and they have been most cooperative in providing the necessary care for the children. It is this cooperation which makes a real success of the health program. I am deeply grateful for it.

I also wish to express appreciation to Mr. Martineau, the School Board and Teachers for their helpfulness.
