SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Feb. 1, 1924 to Feb. 1, 1925

On the whole our schools have made satisfactory progress during the past year. Sickness has interfered with our attendance to quite an extent, therefore our record in this respect is not as high as we had hoped to make it. Our percent, however, is about 90, which is no loss over previous years. Some of our schools which have been fortunate enough to have no epidemics have maintained an average of nearly 95 percent of attendance.

Standard tests are being used to measure the progress of the pupils in reading, and later in the year progress in arithmetic will also be measured. The reading tests given in October showed many very creditable records, and it is expected that the ones to be given in March will produce results equally satisfactory.

The operetta given by the pupils of the village school last May was a marked success in every way. This type of work is very beneficial to children as it produces a spirit of school loyalty, and utilizes the tendency to self expression in a helpful way. Part of the proceeds went toward the expense of installing electric lights in the building and the remainder to purchase clocks for the school rooms.

We have about the same number of young people attending secondary schools as last year. They are doing very satisfactory work and thus merit our encouragement and support.

The basement at Riverside has been repaired and should now remain in good condition for years.

The Riverside building, as well as those in the rural districts, should be painted, and something will need to be done to the furnace at the village.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation for the co-operation of pupils, teachers, and the public in general. We feel that the public is with us, and will support us loyally in giving to our young people every opportunity possible for securing an efficient education.
