# Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting, March 8, 1932

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the inhabitants of the town of Tuftonboro in the ( L. S. )  
County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Tuftonboro on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To cast your ballot for all State and District Delegates to the national party convention for the nomination of President and Vice-President of the United States, said Electors for which are to be balloted for at the General Election to be held November 8th. next.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,750.00 for State Aid Maintenance of the highways of said Town; the State contributing therefore the sum of \$5,250.00.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,738.50 for State Aid Construction of its highways; the State to give the sum of \$1,738.00.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,725.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance of its highways; the State to give the sum of \$5,775.00.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for a new entrance to Wawbeek Road agreeable to a petition signed by Chester I. Campbell.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the continuance for the building of a hard surface road on Tuftonboro Neck.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Pine Blister Rust control.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the payment of a long term note due February 1, 1933.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes to be raised and collected for the year 1932.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Fire Protection.

13. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to forewith order the person, or party who moved, or caused to be moved, a building, and construct a fence on a part of the public highway, a road duly laid out, built, and repaired by said Town, leading from Main Street in Melvin Village, by land of Horace A. Walker and Melvin River to Lake Winnepesaukee, such removal to be completed on, or by April 15th, 1932, in default of which our said Officers shall apply to the Superior Judicial Court, to be holden at Ossipee in May, for such an order, and for the penalty, by law prescribed agreeable to a petition signed by C. W. Davis, et als.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
