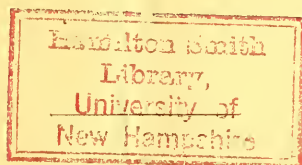

ROLL OF PERFECT ATTENDANCE.

SCHOOL No. 1. First term—Mabel J. Noyes, Nellie O. Noyes, Mattie F. Dockham, Myrtie B. Dockham, Flossie M. Edgerly. Second term—Hattie M. Cogswell.

SCHOOL No. 2. First term—Irving G. Lewis. Second term, Ernest Lane.

SCHOOL No. 3. First term—none. Second term—none.

In No. 1 we have had two terms, 18 weeks in all. The first term was taught by Miss Stella Coombs, the average attendance was very poor. The second term was taught by Miss Isa Nute, with very good advancement in their studies and good order, which crown the schools. In No. 2 we have had two terms, 22 weeks in all. Miss Mattie E. Merrill was employed as teacher each term, and was well liked by parents and scholars. She did all in her power to make this a profitable school, and at the close of the school we found good advancement had been made. In No. 3 we have had two terms, 18 weeks in all. Miss Ina Robins was employed as teacher each term.
