Warrant for Town Meeting

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Errol, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges, for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Public Library.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid construction.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to build a Library building and raise money for same.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to buy the Fire Truck now leased by the Selectmen and build place for same by drawing money from Savings Account.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to withdraw money from Savings account to defray expenses of Vidal case.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 for sidewalk.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 as a retaining fee for Dr. H. H. Nadig for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act under the laws of 1933.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 for the cemetery.

Art. 13. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.
