


REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

The following statistics in the usual form, and a few remarks by way of information and explanation are submitted to the attention of the residents of the district, especially to those who are interested in the schools.

The Board would call attention to the continued improvement in the schools during the year. The school district has supported two schools, one at the village and one at East Hebron. Each school has had three terms in all, making thirty-one weeks of schooling for each. We think the School Board and citizens ought to feel proud that we have been able to have such a number of weeks' schooling. We feel sure we never have had so many weeks in one year in this town before.

Some complaints have reached our ears that the schools are too long and the scholars are getting tired and so lose interest, but I think if they would compare the length of our schools with those of the villages and cities that they would not complain. Our greatest trouble has been in not having schooling enough. Now that we are having more let us be most grateful.*

At the beginning of the school year we did not expect so many weeks. If we had it might have been possible to have had it kept more weeks in the warm weather. We were deterred by the vaccination from having the school begin a week or two earlier.

Scholars that are interested in the school work will be more regular at school if the parents show their interest for the child and their best good, how much greater will be the child's interest. We hope that the parents will awake to the necessity of knowing that their children are in the school room during school hours. The law requires that every scholar between certain ages shall attend school all the time school is in session, unless excused by the School Eoard for certain reasons. We hope that in this small town it wil not be necessary to enforce the law.

There are those who seem to think that their children ought to receive the personal attention of the teacher at all times when desired, that every arrangement of the sclooll shall be perfectly satisfactory to them.

As it has been urged in our reports before, that the parents should visit the schools and learn just where the wrong belongs, to the teacher, parents or children. The influence in the home is plainly seen in the child at school.

Let us teach our children at home good morals, purity of thought and speech, and all things necessary for good citizenship. The training in the schools is only a factor in the preparation for the work of life.

The spring term at East Hebron was taught by Miss Helen Clay. She was a teacher of some experience and one that does credit to herself and school.

The fall term was begun by E. Blanche Seavey. She taught some six weeks and was obliged to give up the school on account of sickness. We liked the appearance of Miss Seavey in the school and are assured that her six weeks were profitable ones,

We were unusually fortunate in securing the services of Mr. L. O. Merrill, a graduate of Dartmouth college, to take the school. He taught five and three-fifths weeks of the fall term and also the winter term of ten weeks. He has worked earnestly and faithfully to promote the best interest of the school. His instruction has been thorough and the discipline good.

The village school has been taught for the year by M. Belle Mason, who made for herself a good record as a teacher. Good progress was made in all branches taught, and her work was very gratifying and satisfactory.

The truant officer reports : No. of children, 41; males, 15; females, 26.


