## Report of Board of Education.

---

The schools for the past year have run very smoothly, although there have been several changes in teachers. The spring and fall terms at the North School were taught by Mrs. Georgiana Hodgdon, who resigned. Mr. Herbert M. Prescott was then secured, who was obliged to resign through illness. It was then taught very satisfactorily by Miss Charlotte M. Bragg. At the East School the spring term was taught by Miss Elizabeth Sawyer and the fall and winter terms by Miss Mary O. Evans. The West School was taught by Miss Dorothy L. Eaton, who has given satisfaction.

Extensive repairs were made at the North School and a teacher's desk bought. Minor repairs were made at the East and West Schools, and a new stove was bought for the East School, as the old stove was considered unsafe.

Owing to the lack of funds, the schools were obliged to close two weeks earlier than usual.
