TOWN MEETING WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Landaff, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the 7th day of March, next at eight of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for T.R.A. roads and raise and appropriate money for the same. (\$338.16 town share).
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 to be added to the Equipment Fund.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$1,000.00 from the equipment fund to purchase a body for the Town truck.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for the Landaff Vol. Fire Department.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Lisbon Fire Department (by request of the Lisbon Fire Dep't.).
- 9. "To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved".
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

PROGRESS REPORT OF LANDAFF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

During the past year considerable progress has been made in our Volunteer Fire Department, with volunteer help, a cement floor has been laid in the Fire Station, a Red 'phone system was set up with 'phones in the homes of Herbert Gray, Scotland District; Ernest Odell, Blue School District and route #302; Harry Hodge, Ireland and Center Districts; Herman Titus, Jockey Hill District, Landaff Town Hall and our main relay 'phone, with twenty-four hour service, at the home of Frederick Erb.

A siren was purchased for the Fire Station, mounted and in operation from Fire Station and all of the homes where the Red 'phones are installed.

Ernest Odell has constructed a building on his property, installed a heating system, all at his expense, to house a Fire Truck for the protection of Blue School District and residents of Landaff living on route #302.

Herbert Gray provides housing for one Fire Truck during warm weather for better protection for Scotland District.

New additional hose, nozzles and miscellaneous equipment has been purchased and the interior of the Fire Station has been insulated also the walls are being refinished by volunteer help.

A Demonstration of Fire Extinguishers was given at the Fire Station on Old Home Day and a follow up, by the Firemen, to encourage all homes in Landaff to purchase extinguishers (through the Fire Department) was carried out and the results were good.

At the present time the Fire Department has:

One Chevrolet tank truck, capacity of 800 gals., equipped with portable pump.

One International truck, capacity 500 gals., with pump.

One Dodge tank truck, capacity 1200 gals., with pump.

One American La France fire truck equipped with 750 gals. per minute pumper.

2 M.S.A. self-contained breathing apparatus.

The approach to the Fire Station was gravelled, graded, and oiled.

A training course in basic fire fighting practices, under the direction of State Instructor Charles McDonald, was completed and a talk-discussion period was held on First Aid at the Landaff Town Hall with Miss Janet Ray as leader.

It is the hope of the Department to qualify for Mutual Aid in the near future, with everyones help and support it can be done.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalant on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- 1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- 2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- 3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them **dead** out when leaving.
- Most important instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted
 match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

The school health program was carried out as usual. Physical screenings were done on all pupils by Dr. McGregor, the school physician. Notices of any defects found were sent home to the parents.

Heights, weights, audio and visual screenings were done on all children by the school nurse. Notices of any problems were sent home to the parents. Several children were found to need glasses and some were fitted through their family optometrist.

The dental clinic was carried out with the second grade pupils by Dr. Clark. The Crest Dental Program was again used in the third grade.

The vitamin program was started in November and continued through the winter months. Each child received one capsule daily, with parents consent.

Speech therapy was started in November at the Lisbon Regional School with Landaff pupils being transported once a week throughout the year. This program is under the direction of the North Country Education Services. In May Mr. Brandon of the Portsmouth Rehabilitation Center, an audioligist, did a complete audio testing on several children with suspected hearing difficulties. This service proved very valuable.

Immunization clinics were held with the assistance of the State Department of Public Health. Children were given polio, rubella, measles, or DT boosters as needed.

Several children were seen at the various State sponsored clinics such as sight conservation, cardiac, and crippled children.

In May a preschool vision and hearing screening program was held at the Lisbon Regional School with Landaff children participating.

In February I took an extension course from Plymouth on BEHAVORIAL MODIFICATION TECHNIQUES offered at the Vocational School in Berlin. This summer I took an instructors course in MULTI-MEDIA FIRST AID offered by the Red Cross in Concord. I am now certified as a school nurse by the State Department of Education.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the Board of Education and the Citizens of the Landaff School District:

As Superintendent of Schools, it is with pleasure that I submit to you my seventh annual report.

During the past year (1970-1971), there were 18 pupils enrolled at the Blue School in Landaff. The average membership was 17.4 pupils. There were seven pupils attending Lisbon in Grades 3-6, eight pupils attending in Grades 7-8 and thirteen pupils attending in Grades 9-12. There were one elementary and two high school pupils attending Haverhill Cooperative School.

This school year (1971-1972), there are nineteen pupils attending the Blue School in Grades 1-5. There are eight pupils attending Lisbon in Grades 1-6, four pupils attending in Grades 7-8 and thirteen pupils attending in Grades 9-12. At the Haverhill Cooperative Schools there is one elementary pupil and one high school pupil attending at the present time.

As you know your Board of Education and your Supervisory Union Administration have done much to supply your teacher, Mrs. Thelma Whitcher, with as many as possible of the newer materials so important to education today. Your Board of Education has expended the funds with a great deal of vision and yet, as always, have remained conscious of cost in the areas of textbooks, library materials, teaching supplies and equipment as related to the teaching of your children. These expenditures, plus the increases noted for 1972-73, are present because of the belief that the young people in our charge need the materials, as well as a consciousness of the minimum standards set forth by the State of New Hampshire. The budget for 1972-73 and the articles in the warrant, will as approved, continue to strengthen your curriculum.

May I, as your Superintendent, encourage you to consult with your Board of Education and meet these responsibilities affirmatively.

As Superintendent, I feel it would be beneficial for the people of Landaff to fully understand the services provided by your Central Office, as it serves all of the towns located in Supervisory Union #35. All of the services provided by the staff of White Mts. Supervisory Union #35 relate most definitely to all the children located within the boundaries of Supervisory Union #35.

Our Assistant Superintendent, Mr. Joseph Joseph is in charge of personnel, recruitment, teacher training, etc. Our Business Administrator, Mr. Bruce Moore is in charge of all phases of purchasing, state and federal financial reports, audits, insurance, transportation and all of the legal facets of the Supervisory Union.

Mrs. Rita Besaw as Teacher Consultant for Elementary Curriculum co-ordinates all of the elementary programs in the Supervisory Union in a most up-to-date method. Because of the efficiency she exudes in her field, we have found that the elementary programs throughout the Union are progressing toward a point which will make the implementation of minimum standards very effective.

Mr. Daniel Worcester is in charge of Pupil Personnel and deals with those children that have special problems. We are all conscious, because of the increased knowledge present today, that there are many handicaps that have been revealed to educators that they were not familiar with in past years such as: speech and hearing, retardation and perceptual, as well as physical handicaps. Mr. Worcester helps us to maintain the continuity of our educational programs while at the same time helping our special children to obtain the most possible from our educational programs.

Mr. Clifford Boivin is our Director for Vocational Education and although he is not directly involved with elementary programs, he provides continuity and special help to those students coming from the elementary levels to the junior and senior high levels. It appears that in future years, a good deal more emphasis will be placed on vocational training and the sooner this vocational training can be handled by our schools, the sooner our children will be prepared for the job world and I do believe this will tend to improve the economy and wealth of our area of the state.

The Central Office wishes to extend the citizens of Landaff an invitation to visit us and become more aware of the services provided by our staff and the benefits which are derived by all the towns served by our Supervisory Union.

In closing I wish to thank the members of the Landaff Board of Education for their efforts in the betterment of the education of your school district. We also wish to express our gratitude to Mrs. Whitcher for her concern for the needs of the Landaff children and her interest in the plan of education that our Supervisory Union is developing.
