### Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

---

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To see if the town will vote to have a Liquor Agent the ensuing year.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money, as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair and construction of Sidewalks and Sewers for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars for the improvement of the Cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

9th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to pay the Firemen at West Lebanon at the same rate the Firemen at the Center Village are being paid, or act thereon.

10th. To hear the report of the Selectmen relative to the enlargement of the Cemetery at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

11th. To hear the report of the Auditors and Town School Board.

12th. To determine the division of the School money for the ensuing year.

13th. To see if the town will vote to remit the charge for the use of the Town Hall for the Lecture Course during the past winter, in consideration of the balance of proceeds being turned over to the town, to be applied towards re-seating said Hall.

14th. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 124 of the Public Statutes, having reference to Dealers in Old Metals.

15th. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to pay the sum of seventy-five dollars towards building a foot bridge over the Mascoma river on Mahan Flat, or act thereon.

The highway expense this year runs higher than for some time past partly on account of the repairs on several bridges. The bridge over Connecticut river was replanked using 16114 feet of timber. Benton bridge repairs took 7534 feet; the bridge at Scytheville took 5629 feet; the one near S. Cole & Son's shop was rebuilt, using 14462 feet. The iron bridge and sidewalk, which was widened took 3469 feet and some others out of the ordinary. As spruce and oak was, used this expense adds about \$600 additional to the highway accounts for this year. Changing the direction and grade on Highland avenue with the bank wall cost \$150. The hill near M. H. Barstows was repaired so it will not trouble again probably for years as a ditch 4 feet wide was cut in the centre of the road, filled with cobble stones, etc., for a long distance to drain this clay bed at a cost of about \$200. For years this has been a bad road in the spring to pass over, but these repairs should make it all right.

## Report of the Board of Health.

---

The vital statistics do not indicate any marked prevalence of special diseases. There were seven deaths by consumption, a small number by a disease which is said to destroy more of the human race than any other. Pneumonia, seven. There were twelve cases of typhoid fever reported; of these a small number were severe and one only was fatal. Of the two much dreaded diseases, scarlet fever and diphtheria, there were no cases, though the diseases have been very prevalent in many places.

The births fell off in number from preceding years. Deaths were in excess of last year. The ages of those who died were remarkable. Between 70 and 80, 6; between 80 and 90, 18; over 90, 3, indicating that 27, more than one-third of the whole, exceeded three score and ten, the usual limit of human life. As a matter of fact, old age was given as the cause of death in more cases than any other disease.

All this shows that the sanitary condition of the town is very much improved, by the construction of sewers and more carefulness about the houses and surroundings.

## CEMETERY REPORTS.

---

The committee met April 20, 1899, and organized as follows: Chairman, F. C. Churchill; Secretary and Treasurer, C. E. Hildreth; Superintendent of the West Lebanon Cemetery, S. L. Farman; Superintendent of Glenwood and the other Cemeteries, A. B. Downs.

### Old Pine Cemetery.

A large amount of work was done in this cemetery during the past season in trimming the dead branches from the trees, cleaning up the rubbish that had accumulated for years; about fifty large loads were drawn from the cemetery besides quite a quantity that was burned on the ground. The wall was repaired and some work was done in straightening up stones. The old road leading to the cemetery was put in order by the road agent, Daniel Carlton, and a good many visited the cemetery for the first time.

About 130 feet of fence should be built the coming season and the straightening up of head stones should be finished and then the cemetery will be in very good order.

### The Village Cemetery.

About the usual amount of work was done in keeping the cemetery in order and straightening and lining up head stones. A part of the fence was painted.

A section of the fence on the south side should be rebuilt as the posts are of wood and nearly all of them are rotted off and other sections need painting very much.

### Glenwood Cemetery.

More work was done in cleaning up and in keeping this cemetery in order than in any previous year. The addition bought of Mr. Kendrick, in the westerly part of the cemetery was cleaned up and fenced, adding very much to the appearance of that part of the cemetery. The soil from a part of one of the avenues was removed and used in grading lots and the road was filled up with gravel, making a much better road and also improving the looks of that part of the cemetery. Work was done toward draining the lower part of the cemetery.

The cemetery needs a shed for the storage of plank and the larger tools so that the shed that now is used for that purpose can be used for a horse shed for which it was intended.

A new plan of the cemetery was made during the past year showing the changes that have been made in the lines at different times.

### The Cemetery at West Lebanon.

The grounds were thoroughly raked in the spring, the shrubbery trimmed and all refuse was carted off.

A strip on the east side which has been used as a dumping ground, was plowed, smoothed and enriched, then seeded to grass, thereby adding a few lots for occupancy. A neglected spring in one corner was reclaimed, newly curbed and a pump placed in it. The fence was righted up and repainted. The hearse house raised to a proper level and repainted. The whole yard was kept in order by mowing and trimming several times, the lawn mower being used when practicable. Several flower beds were maintained beside the driveway.

Tools were furnished and put at the disposal of private parties to improve their lots.

The improvements made gave a stimulus to lot owners, the result being the grading, enriching and proper caring for twenty-five lots according to the committee's ideas. On the whole more has been done and more interest taken in the care of this beautifully located spot than before for twenty years.

The enlargement of this cemetery in the near future is imperative.
