THE TOWN WARRANT
The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 p. m., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

3. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this town?"

4. To see if the Town will vote to continue to maintain its existing municipal court so long as its present judge remains in office.

5. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the zoning ordinances as proposed by the Planning Board.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for interest on same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,600.00 for Recreation as asked for by the Recreation Committee.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for the care of Cemeteries.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for town highways.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$558.63 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$724.17.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 in addition to the joint T. R. A. fund.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Concord Hospital.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of completing the layout of 2230 feet of new road over an existing public rightway at the head of Pleasant Lake, leading from Rte. 107 to the Gulf Road so called.

16. To see if the Town will vote to acquire land in the Town of Northwood and authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to take land within the municipal limits, in fee by gift, purchase, or right of eminent domain for the purpose of establishing a new town dump in accordance with the provisions of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated Chapter 31:92.

17. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$10,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck, to be paid for as follows:

(a) \$4,000 to be raised and appropriated in 1964.

(b) \$6,000.00 to be borrowed by the Town under the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, RSA Chapter 33.3 and amendments thereto, \$3,000.00 of which is to be raised and appropriated with interest during 1965 and \$3,000.00 to be raised and appropriated with interest during 1966.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Alvin K. Leighton a gift of pictures and maps to be displayed in the town Libraries at the discretion of the Selectmen.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest under the will of Florence L. Miner, late of Northwood, wherein the residuary estate is bequeathed as follows:

“ELEVENTH: All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate after the same has been converted into cash by my executors, I give, bequeath and devise to the Town of Northwood in trust and under the control of the trustees of trust funds of said town, to be prudently invested and the income therefrom after capital expenditures herein authorized are complied with to be expended annually for the general upkeep and care of the East Northwood Cemetery as hereinafter authorized:

1. The sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars of the principal of this residue fund shall be expended for the purpose of providing an adequate well or water supply in the East Northwood Cemetery with an electric pump of the automatic type and necessary installation of water pipes leading from the pump or pressure storage tank to convenient outlets throughout the cemetery. It is my direction that this installation be made by the Selectmen of the Town of Northwood in cooperation with the executors of this will and the trustees of the trust funds of the Town of Northwood and that the payment for the installation shall be made by the executors out of the established sum and the balance thereof paid by said excutors to the trustees of the trust funds of said town as a fund for the further repair and maintenance of this system. In the event that this balance does not appear to be sufficient to provide ample income for this purpose, I do hereby authorize my executors to increase the maintenance fund to the extent that there shall be at least the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars for this purpose or such further amount as they shall consider necessary to accomplish this purpose.

2. The balance of this residuary fund after the installation of the water system and provision for its maintenance shall be paid to the Town of Northwood and by said town shall be held in trust and under the control of the trustees of trust funds to be prudently invested and the income therefrom to be expended annually for the upkeep and care of said East Northwood Cemetery, such upkeep and care to include but not limited to walks, driveways and the care of neglected lots therein and if

necessary, further repairs and maintenance charges for the care of the well or water system if income from the fund provided is not ample for a particular period.”

and to authorize the designated town officers to carry out the same in accordance with the expressed intent of the testatrix.

20. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.90 from Mary Pizutel et al, to establish a capital reserve fund to be used by the Recreation Commission to promote a public beach at the head of Jenness Pond adjacent to the junction of Rte. 107 and the Northwood Town Road.

21. To see if the Town will vote to place Winter Maintenance out for bids. Bids to include salting, sanding, and plowing. The Town to furnish the sand and salt stock pile. All bids must be in the Selectmen's hands by July 31, 1964. (the above article is by petition).

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purpose of tarring Blakes Hill Road in said Northwood, which is located off Route No. 4, for a distance of one mile beyond the portion of said road which is presently tarred. (the above article is by petition).

23. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

We are now midway through the third year of successful operation of our new school. Once again I wish to express a debt of gratitude to the parents of Northwood, and to the teachers of the school for their great effort and cooperation.

Also, to Mr. Martell, a special note of appreciation for his outstanding accomplishments in the music department. The Spring Music Festival was a tremendous success. The school band captured top honors at both the Rochester and Deerfield fairs.

Once again the teachers deserve special mention for their fine work and cooperation that made our second annual Science Fair a highlight of academic achievement in the science department. This year's fair will be held in May.

There were no changes in personnel in September and this tends to lend continuity to the educational program of the school. The citizens and pupils of Northwood are again enjoying a very successful year the able administration of Principal Gardner and a dedicated staff of teachers.

Educational TV, Channel 11 continues to enrich the curriculum in many areas and has proved to have become an essential part of your education program.

This year the Phonetic Keys to Reading, published by the Economy Company, School Book Publishers, has been introduced as a supplement to the reading program. This is a complete reading program which embodies all other good reading skills being taught along with phonetic training, and special emphasis is given to comprehension.

It is recommended that the play area in back of the school be paved. This would serve a dual purpose, it would provide a better play area and delay the wear and tear of the tiled floors caused by mud and grit of many feet.

Effective July 1st, 1964, the towns of Brookfield, Middleton and Wakefield will be added to Supervisory Union No. 44. This is in accordance with the State Board of Education's master plan. The Board also voted to tender an Assistant Superintendent to this Union, recognizing the size and supervisory responsibilities of the present union as well as the additional burden that would be placed upon the central office by adding the three districts mentioned above.

In conclusion, I should like to express my appreciation for the cooperation given me during the year by the citizens, school board, teachers and pupils of Northwood.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Town of Northwood

To the Superintendent of Schools:

It gives me pleasure to present a report of the health program as carried out in the schools of Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford during the school year of 1962-1963.

The Suncook Bank of Suncook, N. H., has very generously donated a School Vision Tester to these five towns, to be used by the school nurse. This is a great help in testing vision since it provides for correct lighting and distance under all conditions. The Suncook Bank is to be commended for its fine community spirit.

Each school has had its share of the various contagious diseases and skin diseases, but these were well controlled and presented no major problem. The parents were most cooperative in this matter, as well as in obtaining professional care and treatment for any reported physical defects. Such cooperation is a necessity in carrying out an effective school health program, and I wish to express my sincere appreciation for it.

The following is a brief summary of the health services provided in the Northwood Elementary School during this past year:

A Pre-School Clinic was held May 23, 1963. It was attended by 25 children, and they were given a routine health inspection by the nurse. Where any defect was noted, the child's parents were notified so that correction might be made before the child was enrolled in school in September.

During the year 45 home calls were made.

Referral was made to the State Sight Conservation Program for the care of 1 child; and another received treatment through the New Hampshire Crippled Children's Services.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, the School Board, the Teachers and many others for their excellent cooperation.
