To the Inhabitants of the town of Roxbury in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Roxbury Town Hall in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to hold Town Meetings in the School House, if the School Board will consent.
- 4. To see if the town will vote for State Aid Construction on the Branch Road or for Class V construction as prescribed by the State Engineer.
- 5. Voted that the selectmen are hereby authorized to sell at public auction or private sale to such purchaser and for such price as they may determine, any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interest of the town.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 for white pine blister rust.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Kingsbury Hill Road.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to take the relief money spent by the selectmen out of town charges or raise the same.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise money for poor relief for 1936.
 - 10. To choose a trustee for the trust fund for three years.
- 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers and pass any action thereto.
- 12. To transact any other business which may come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Roxbury:

I herewith submit my thirteenth annual report as superintendent of schools.

It seems right and proper to utilize a little space in this report to bring before the parents and citizens some of the objectives of the public school system of to-day: (1) To develop a sound mind in a strong and healthy body. (2) To develop the ability to read and write, to think and put that thought into action. During the year we have tried not only to teach the child the mechanics of reading but also the getting of the thought from the printed page and then expressing it in an effective way to the listener. That is we are emphasizing oral reading. (3) We recognize the need of more effective teaching of technical grammar as well as the use of correct expressions in the Mother tongue. (4) To endow our pupils with the knowledge, skills and mental power to earn a reasonable living in the modern world of to-day. (5) To devote the use of leisure time to worthy activities and pleasures. (6) To develop a fine spiritual character that is trusted and admired.

To the development of these objectives and others not mentioned we invite your cooperation, support and suggestions.
