- 1. To choose all necessary town officers.

- 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Report of the Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

Herewith is presented the annual report.

The Village school had an average membership of 20 the past year and with an attendance of 93.89. The present year we have enrolled: 27; Boys, 13, Girls 14. The school census for 1926-27 gives the number of children between 5-16: Boys, 13; Girls, 14; Total 27. The entering class of 5 and the second year class of five lead us to expect the school to maintain its present size for several years. The graduating classes are small, two for last year and one this year. Eight are now attending Gorham high school.

The school building has been properly screened. The

roof on the north side must be shingled.

The report for the fall term shows an attendance of 95.13. Sickness in the lower classes hampered the beginners but the health conditions of the school as a whole have been excellent. The return of Miss Bean for the third year enables us to continue the satisfactory school work.

Obituary

We were all saddened by the accidental death during the summer of Clifford Hayes who had completed his eighth grade and was to enter the high school. He was a promising lad and his loss is keenly felt.

Mr. Chester D. Peabody who has served for many years as a member of the school board died at Concord, N. H., February 8, 1927. He was faithful and obliging and very loyal to the schools and to those who had them in charge. He is sincerely mourned by his fellow workers and by the children whom he served so well. The schools and the civic life of Shelbnrue, equally, will feel the loss of this well beloved citizen. We wish to extend our sympathy to his family in their sudden bereavement.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation for the hearty cooperation of the School Board and citizens of Shelburne in securing for your children proper educational advantages.
