

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 12th of March next, at nine-thirty in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a town clerk, one selectman for three years, one selectman for one year, and all other necessary town officers.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal and sanding.
- Article 4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for general highway expense, \$1,000.00 of which to be used on the dangerous corner on High Street near the Ripley and Dexter Homesteads.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,700.00 to build a bridge in conjunction with the water hole near the Deem homestead on West Hill.
- Article 6. To see if the town will accept State Aid for Construction of Class 5 roads.
- Article 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for street lighting.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes, excepting poll taxes, paid before dates to be designated at this meeting, and all poll taxes shall be collected on or before July 1, 1946.

- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the police department.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the water system.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for the care of shade trees.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of employing a district nurse and other health activities.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for a road scraper.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the construction of a sidewalk on the North side of Russell Ave.; one-third of the cost to be paid by the abutters.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the construction of a sidewalk and drain on the West side of Prospect Street from High Street to Russell Avenue.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$135.00 for observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to allow the American Legion to use the town hall one Friday night each month without pay.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.
- Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 in addition to the amount required by law for the public library.

- Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$118.00 for the purpose of advertising the resources and natural advantages of the town, said sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.
- Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the installation and maintenance of a new street light on Marlboro Road, south of the home of George Abare.
- Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 to create a Capitol Reserve Fund to be used by the water department.
- Article 25. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Trustees of Trust Funds to accept such funds as the Trustees deem adequate.
- Article 26. To see if the town will vote to pay the Treasurer of the Trustees of Trust Funds \$10.00 per year for his services.
- Article 27. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$561.59 as bequeathed to the town by the late Susan M. Burpee. Said fund to be used in the erection of a Public Library on land given to the town by Walter N. Gay. This fund is to be expended by the Trustees of the Public Library at such time as the town shall so vote.
- Article 28. To see if the town will vote to accept as a gift of William A. Parker, a certain tract of land situated North of Mountain View Cemetery. If accepted it is stipulated that the town shall plant a row of evergreen trees along the North boundary of said tract.
- Article 29. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.
- Article 30. To hear the reports of agents, officers, or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

Article 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Troy:

I herein submit my third annual report as superintendent of schools.

The American Constitution has proved itself to be—as the great statesman William H. Gladstone once said, "the most wonderful work ever struck off at a given time by the brain and purpose of man." Its fundamental purpose—"to promote the general welfare," as defined in the Preamble, makes public education for desirable purposes the most important individual, community, state and national enterprise. Now that we have plunged into the Atomic Era a higher level of universal education is imperative.

"The men and women in uniform are coming home having finished the gigantic job of making human freedom possible. Victory in the war against prejudice, greed and ignorance necessitates another great invasion in which the penalties of failure are as grave as those in military catastrophies. The knowledge, the skills and the understandings gained by our young people in the next few years will determine whether this country can or will solve the difficult social, economic and political problems that make peace possible. The implications of all of this is very clear. Now, in every land, in every language, the teachers have a key position in the most important business of all. These commandoes of the peace must be well trained and equipped if their mission of 'the general welfare' is to be accomplished."

America's future is in the school children of today. In the text of a new film—"Assignment: Tomorrow", just produced by the National Education Association, these children and the kind of adults every right thinking person wants them to become, are described as follows:

"They're scattered like millions of seeds all over a great fertile land. The stock is good and the land is rich—that should mean a bumper crop.

"A crop of good citizens—of voters who will know what they want and how to choose honest, capable leaders.

"A crop of cooperative citizens—who will get along with each other regardless of their race, creed or color.

"A crop of self-supporting citizens—who will like the American standard of living and who can all afford to have it.

"A crop of healthy citizens—who will know how to keep themselves well—who will have eating, living and playing habits that build strength and stamina.

"A crop of happy citizens—who will produce a culture that can be enjoyed."

"A crop of active productive citizens—who have learned to play the game well.

"This is the wealth of our country—a crop of Americans, at peace with the world. It can be a rich crop if it is cultivated and nourished in good schools."

The above objectives cannot be obtained without complete cooperation from the homes. The laxity of parents is undoubtedly the greatest contribution to juvenile delinquency.

A study of maladjusted pupils in schools also indicate the need for more so called extra-curricula activities in the lower grades.

The decrease in enrollment in the upper grades in the Troy schools is in pattern with the general trend. There has been a state wide decrease in high school membership of more than twenty percent since the war started. The general increased enrollment in the lower grades is also reflected in Troy.

There were 219 different pupils registered during the last school year. Thirteen pupils had been previously registered in some other district in New Hampshire. There were fifteen pupils who were not promoted.

The usual standard tests were administered to all pupils.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF TROY HIGH SCHOOL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my first annual report as headmaster of Troy High School.

IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SCHOOL BUILDING

During the summer and fall months considerable work was done in improving the school building. A sound-proof ceiling and fluorescent lights were installed in the shop. This addition has greatly improved the appearance and working conditions of the room and is genuinely appreciated by both pupils and teachers.

Electrical outlets have been installed in the laboratory and office. Three-way switches have been installed in the hallways to insure safer and more economical use of the

corridor lights.

Under this heading of Improvements, I wish to mention two interesting pupil projects worked out by the Shop and Home Economics classes supervised by Mr. Pierce and Miss Nowicki.

The Shop classes have converted a room, formerly a girls' cloakroom, into a neat and well lighted office. All alterations, other than the moving of the telephone and the installation of electrical fixtures, were worked out by the boys.

The Junior and Senior Home Economics classes undertook the project of reconverting the former office room into

an attractive girls' room.

In both instances the work done was a practical application of the knowledge gained in their respective classes. The results have been most gratifying.

CURRICULUM

There have been no changes in the curriculum this year. Latin was offered but, due to insufficient course registration, it was discontinued for the present school year.

SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

The school lunch program is being continued this year with financial assistance from the Federal Government. At the present time an average of over 100 pupils are receiving, daily, the benefits of the hot lunch and the milk programs.

TESTING PROGRAMS

A series of achievement and mental ability tests have been given to all members of the school. This testing program, when properly used, aids the staff materially in determining the strengths and weaknesses of the individual pupil. Proper emphasis may then be placed to bring about the most desirable results.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

During the Fall term numerous extra-curricular activities have been carried on by the pupils.

A three-act play was sponsored by the newly formed Athletic Association. In this production, thirty-two of the forty-five pupils in the school assisted in some material way.

The staff of the school magazine "The Trojan," is preparing material for its publication in the Spring. The smaller pupil enrollment this year has necessitated the printing of only one issue to prevent an unnecessary burden on the pupils' time.

Numerous dances and school parties have been held by the various classes for the dual purpose of raising money and having an enjoyable social time.

An athletic program is being carried on with a complete schedule of basketball games for both boys' and girls' teams. Miss Phyllis Trombley of Keene Teachers' College very kindly volunteered her services as coach of the girls' team. Her work is greatly appreciated.

At this point, I should like to state that there is a very definite need for a combination auditorium-gymnasium. Such a building would aid tremendously in the development of the social and physical education of our youth. Statistics from the War Department show that we have been giving too little time in our schools to the development of strong and healthy bodies through adequate physical education under clean and healthful conditions.

A building of the type mentioned above might serve as a fitting memorial to the young men and women of Troy who served so valiantly in World War II.

In conclusion, I wish to thank all who have contributed in any way to the successful operation of the school.

REPORT OF SUPERVISOR OF MUSIC

To Mr. John H. Frye, Superintendent of Schools,

Troy School District:

During the five months I have been teaching music in the grades and high school, I have endeavored to promote the students' interest, understanding, appreciation and interpretation through participation and listening in order to make for a fuller and richer life.

The technical fundamentals of music, relative to the grades thus far, have been presented, and "community singing" has been encouraged and helpful since I believe that only through active participation can true appreciation and understanding be realized.

The appreciation lessons, that have been presented during my program, included Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf," Saint Saens's "The Carnival of the Animals" and Tschaikovsky's "Nutcracker Suite," which the children have enjoyed very much.

To exemplify the time and efforts put into these phases of music the elementary grades presented a public Christmas program at the Town Hall, December 18, 1945, which was very well attended and enjoyed. The program included songs and recitations by the primary grades and a pageant depicting the birth of Jesus by the intermediate grades. In regard to the presentation of the pageant I would like to express here my sincere thanks and appreciation for the cooperation shown me Mr. Hanson, Mr. Pierce and the Manual Arts department, the teachers, and the parents and friends of the community.

In the high school a girls' vocal class and a boys' vocal class have been organized. During these periods the better types of vocal music are interpreted and appreciated through good tone quality, enunciation, expression, mood, and rhythm.

Students have been encouraged to attend the musical opportunities that come to Troy and Keene, and many have. Through the Fuller-Bartlett Fund committee in Keene it was my privilege to distribute several tickets for the concert presented by the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, January 20, 1946.

Due to the competent instruction and interest of the teachers I feel that music is vital and worthwhile in the lives of the children of Troy. And so again, may I express my sincere thanks and appreciation for the cooperation shown me by you, Headmaster Hanson and all the teachers.


