TOWN CHAIRMEN are fully informed; STATE ADVISORY AGENTS can help to start logging by suggesting names of operators and giving other useful advice; FEDERAL AGENCIES are increasing the number of log storage places as rapidly as possible. INDIVIDUALS MUST NOW COOPERATE!

*Forest fire danger for several years will be greater than usual.* So much work must be done by public agencies to reduce hazard along roadsides, near improved and other exposed areas that many places will remain hazardous for some time to come. The schools of the district have again provided for the children of school age an opportunity to attend a full year of 360 half-days. However, the percent of attendance was lower than the year previous and below the state average for the year. This is probably due in part to the long absences of pupils afflicted with whooping cough and measles,—diseases which were prevalent last year. There are other absences of pupils for no very good reason. Parents should make every effort to keep their children in school. Failure to win promotion, loss of advancement and gaps in pupils' knowledge are results of absence. The time spent by teachers in assisting pupils who have been absent might be spent in advancing the progress of all the pupils. The habitual absentee takes from all the others, time which might have been invested in progress. In case of illness of a pupil this is unavoidable, but absence for some trivial reason is inexcusable.

In the average attendance for the year there has been an increase of about six over the previous year. The total number of unrepeated registrations for the year was 255. Of these twenty-six were high school tuition pupils and twenty were elementary tuition pupils. This leaves a total of 209 pupils residing in the district and attending public schools.

The health of the pupils has been guarded by the usual medical inspection by Dr. L. H. Cogswell, school physician and Ruth B. Whitcomb, R. N., school nurse. School lunches were served during the winter months with the assistance of the local Red Cross and Warner Woman's Club as noted in our previous report. Though many pupils were absent on account of measles, there is no doubt that others were enabled to attend more regularly on account of this assistance.

In October, 1938 a new electric stove was installed in the Domestic Arts room at the high school without cost to the school. This was done through the courtesy of the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire whose office is located at Contoocook. This not only gives more store room to the class working there, but enables them to learn how to use the most up-to-date equipment.

For improvement of the Commercial Department we would recommend a partition largely of windows be placed across the back of the room so that a small room would be made for students practicing typewriting. The present arrangement where the typewriting has to be carried on in the room with other classwork is inefficient and unsatisfactory. A considerable improvement can thus be made for small cost.

We wish to thank the members of the Prudential Committee, the School Board, teachers and parents for their cooperation in securing the advancement in the education of the pupils of the district.
