Town Warrant.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, in the county of Coos and State aforesaid, qualified to vote in Town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Town of Whitefield, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects, viz :

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk.
- 2nd. To choose one Selectman to serve for a period of three years
- 3rd. To choose a Treasurer.
- 4th. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- 5th. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary,
 - a. To defray Town Charges.
 - b. For proper observance of Memorial Day.
 - c. For maintenance of Public Library.
 - d. To pay on Town Debt.
 - e. To pay interest on Town Debt.
 - f. For maintenance of Town buildings.
 - g. For maintenance of Cemeteries.
 - h. For maintenance of street lights.
 - i. For maintenance and building of sewers.
 - j. For maintenance and building of sidewalks.
 - k. For removal of snow from highways and sidewalks.
 - l. For purchase of new road machine.
 - m. For State Highway maintenance.
 - n. For State Aid Road construction.
 - o. For State Aid Road maintenance.
 - p. For Construction and maintenance of other than State Highway and State Aid Roads.
 - q. For oiling the highways.
 - r. To observe Old Home Week.
 - s. To suppress the White Pine Blister Rust disease.
 - t. For maintenance of public band concerts.
 - u. For purchase of land for new cemetery.

- 6th. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Womans' Study Club the free use of the Town Hall for next year's lecture and musical course, also like use to the Public Schools upon certain occasions.
- 7th. To see if the Town will vote to elect or appoint each year, a Town Budget Committee, to serve in an advisory capacity, without salary.
- 8th. To see what action the Town will take upon acceptance of an offer by Dr. George H. Morrison to make a gift of his hospital and equipment to the Town for maintenance as hospital and training school.
- 9th. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the last Town Meeting in so far as it provided for the election of new members to the Memorial Park Board, and the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 42, Sections 32 to 38, inclusive, of the Public Laws, which provides for the appointment of members to this Board.
- 10th. To enact such By-Laws or Ordinances as may be deemed expedient for the Regulation of Street Traffic.
- 11th. To see if the Town will vote to give prescription permits to the local druggists to sell spirituous liquor for medicinal, mechanical and sacramental purposes under the provisions of our Public Laws.
- 12th. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.
