To the School Board and Citizens of Barrington:

The schools have been doing good work, and I am well pleased with what I have seen of the work of the pupils as I have visited them from time to time. Only one change was made in the teaching force this year. Miss Alice L. Porter replacing Mrs. Reed in the Winkley School. The following is a list of the teachers and the number of pupils in each school:

The building of the chimney at Waldron Hill has made a great improvement in the heating of that school house, and the other houses, where a long pipe is used, should have new chimneys built so that the stove may have a short pipe directly into the chimney. Some repairs, of course, are necessary every year in order to keep the houses comfortable. The floor timbers at Green Hill seem to be giving way, and something must be done there.

Miss Ina Marden, the school nurse, reports that all of the children have been vaccinated, or have promised to have the work done very soon. Miss Marden has made a number of calls at the homes to consult with the parents, and help them to see what is necessary to do in order for the children to be as nearly physically perfect as possible.

The following named pupils deserve honorable mention, as they had perfect attendance for the entire year:

Herbert Truman, Richard Graves, Ernest Nason, Carlton Nason, Ralph Swane, Lucille Boody, Harold Carll, Helen Morrison.

Mrs. Reed reported there were no pupils tardy during the year, but $207\frac{1}{2}$ days were lost because of absence. Mrs. Scruton had but 3 tardy, and Miss Hardy but 7. Schools were closed $4\frac{1}{2}$ days for holidays and other causes. On the whole this was a good showing, and we have reason to feel proud of the interest in school work during the past year.
