



REMARKS.

The schools in town have made good progress during the past year. The attendance has been larger than usual. There were so many in the Primary school we were obliged to put in more seats, and we found that Miss Ricker had more work than she could do, and we hired Miss Elizabeth Rogers to help her part of the day. We would advise that more school room be provided and if you will visit the Primary school we think you will agree with us. There will be a class go into the Grammar school in the spring, but there will be new comers enough to fill their places.

Music was taken up as a study last spring and we would advise that it be continued. It seems to us that it would not be giving it a fair trial to stop now. We were able to hire a teacher in the Grammar school to teach music without extra expense and we have used a little over one-half of the money appropriated for that

purpose.

Miss Florence A. Russell in the Grammar school is a thorough teacher and the school under her management has made good progress. Miss Sadie A. Ricker resigned her position in the Primary school last fall. She had been with us so long that it does not need any words of ours to describe her work. She will long be remembered by both parents and scholars as a model teacher. Miss Charlotte E. Balch has taught the North school for the past year. She has kept the scholars interested in their work as the roll of perfect attendance shows.
