



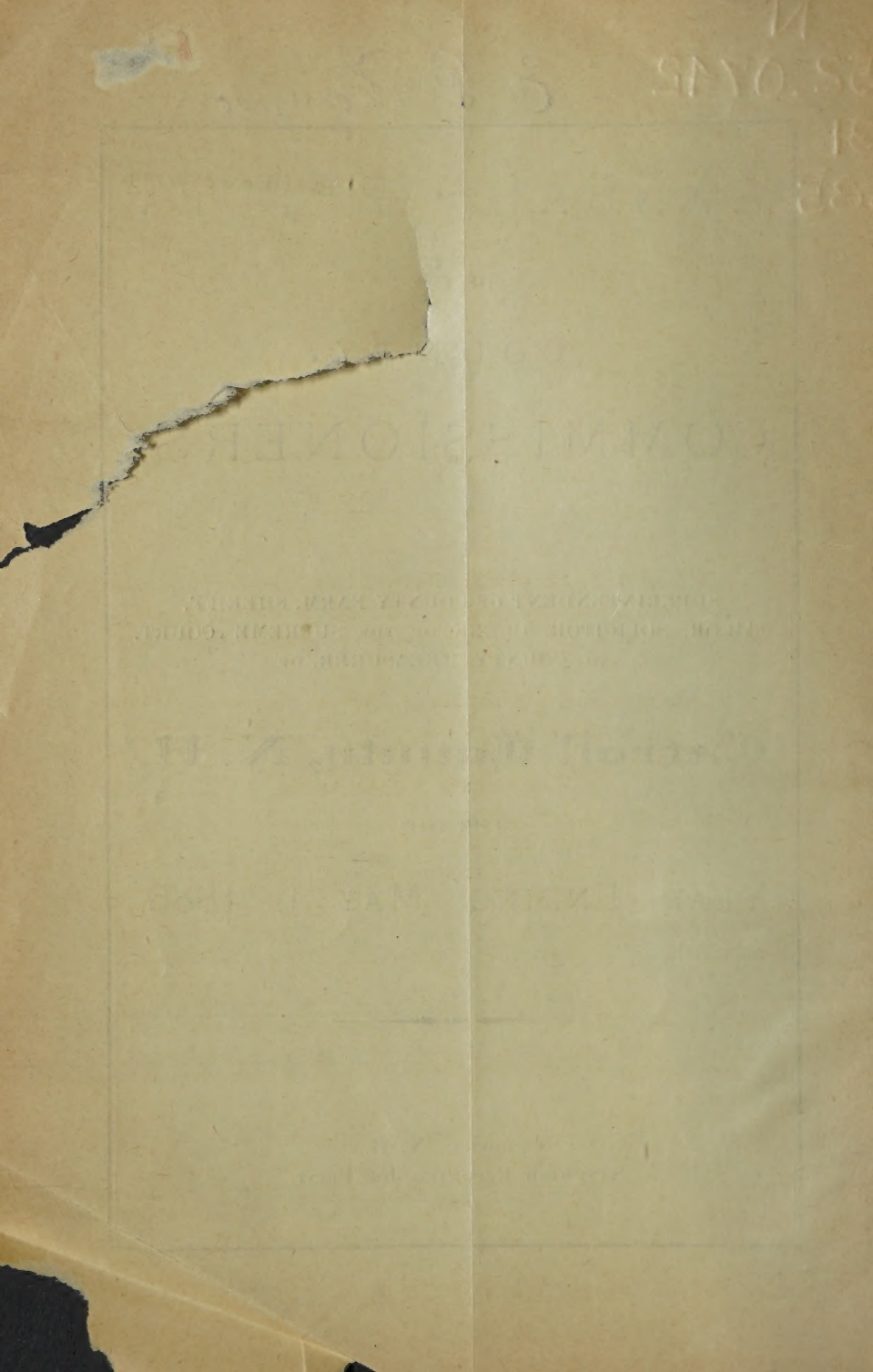

To the Citizens of Carroll County:—

Agrecably to Chapter 28, General Laws, the Commissioners of Carroll County submit the following report for the year ending May 1, 1885, together with the report of other County Officers.

Indebtedness of County May 1, 1885, as per report of Treasurer and Auditors, \$95,649.22. Said debt is bearing interest at 5 per cent.

It will be seen by Treasurer's report that the debt of the County has been reduced 7839.91. The inside of the Court House has been fixed at a cost of \$256.82, and a safe for Commissioners' room at a cost of about \$200.00. The old wooden aqueduct has been removed and a lead pipe put in place of it, at a cost of about \$500.00 for pipe and freight. The small safe in Commissioners' room at Court House has been removed to the office of Superintendent of County Farm.

Affairs at the County Farm, under the superintendence of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Manson, have been carefully managed and the poor have received kind attention. Contributions of books, magazines or papers, illustrated or otherwise, calculated to instruct or amuse, sent to county farm by mail, would be welcomed by the inmates, and a general invitation is extended to all who may be pleased to give.
