SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration my annual report of the condition of your schools. All of your school houses are now in good condition, and will need no extensive repairs for a long time. They compare favorably with the rural schools throughout the state. Heating and ventilating stoves should be installed, however, and I recommend that one stove be installed each year, until the schools are all furnished. It is quite as important to have pure air in a school room, as it is to have pure food to eat and pure water to drink.

The following is a list of the schools, teachers and pupils in each school.

Green Hill, Frances Hill, teacher	22 pupils
North Chatham, Lucretia Chandler, teacher	12 pupils
Eastman, Alice Charles, teacher	9 pupils

Total 43 pupils

The work in the schools is very satisfactory, and many of the pupils have an ambition to enter high schools when prepared. The pupils who are attending high schools are reported as doing good work and standing well in their classes. The schools are well-supplied with books and material for school work. The attendance is good, and is above the average in the state. Only one case of truancy has been reported to me. There seems to be a cooperation between the parents and teachers, and a strong desire on the part of the pupils to take advantage of the excellent advantages in your schools.

The finances of the district are now in a very satisfactory condition, and the accounts are kept in accordance with the

State Laws, and upon forms prescribed by the State Tax Commission.

I wish to express my thanks to the teachers who have so loyally worked for the improvement of the schools, and to the School Board for your support and wise council.
