10. To see what sums of money will be raised for town poor.

11. To see what action town will take on Muzzy Hill road in case the bill should pass in present legislature, and appropriate money for same.

12. To see if the town will raise ten dollars for the G. A. R. memorial exercises.

# School Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Dummer:

Herewith is presented my annual report as superintendent of your schools with a table of school statistics for the last complete school year ending July 1, 1924.

During this year a total of 106 visits were made to the five schools of the town; an average of 21 visits per school for the year of 36 weeks.

The work in general has been carried or much as last year. An outline of work adapted from the State Program of Study was at the beginning of the year furnished to every school in order that there might be a definite aim in every grade. Suitable books for use of the various grades were also selected by the superintendent on his first visits to the schools. At subsequent visits various classes have been examined and tested both orally and in written form to ascertain that the work was being well accomplished.

Relative to the individual schools as a result of the year's observation I would speak as follows:

The Willis School: This school had the largest attendance for the year and was under the charge of a good teacher. The teacher of this school should be especially commended for the interest that she took over the children's activities at recess and noon. In this school the recess games were quite largely supervised by the teacher. This one thing is a very commendable feature, especially in a school of some size. By means of this supervision much of the ordinary playground trouble and difficulty can be avoided.

One seventh grade pupil in this school who seemed to be doing a very high grade of work was promoted to the eighth grade during the year and graduated at the end of the year.

At present there are two pupils in the eighth grade here.

The Wight School: This school was for the year under the charge of a teacher of considerable experience and natural ability. There were some very bright pupils in this school and very good work was done. In some cases more than the required work for the grade was accomplished.

At the present time there is an eighth grade of four pupils all of whom should graduate at the end of the year.

The Pontook School: This school was somewhat handicapped during the year by an outbreak of Scarlet Fever and the school year had to be reduced to 32 weeks. The teacher in this school was very earnest and conscientious in her work but was teaching for the first time and should improve with more experience. On account of the shortened school year and some other factors, the complete work was not accomplished by all the pupils. At present we have an eighth grade of one pupil here. This pupil is doing excellent work and should graduate at the end of the year.

This school building through the efforts of the Board was thoroughly renovated during the last summer and is now in very good condition: a much needed improvement.

West Dummer: This is still not a particularly large school and it would still seem that a saving could be made by transporting these pupils to either Crystal or West Milan School, both of which are within two miles.

Paris School: This school was for the year under charge of a new teacher but one who showed considerable natural ability. The attendance was good for the year and excellent results were obtained. Three pupils in this school completed the work of the eighth grade and were given diplomas in June. At present we have one very excellent pupil in the eighth grade who will no doubt graduate at the end of the year.

In closing I wish to extend thanks to the School Board for assistance rendered during the year.
