Superintendent's Report

To the School Board:

During the year which closed on June 30, 1924, Miss Rounds at Snowville, and Mr. Stuart at South Eaton, continued in their respective positions, and contributed in a large degree to the steady progress of our schools. At the end of this period, however, both teachers resigned. Ernest R. Blake, a graduate of Fryeburg Academy and a summer school attendant at Plymouth Normal School, was appointed to the Snowville position, and Perley K. Towle, a man of long teaching experience, accepted the position at South Eaton. Both schools are running well.

Following out a proposel which I made some time ago it was planned to open both schools earlier than usual this year. Owing to a prevailing illness this was not possible in the case of the Snowville school, but was carried out at South Eaton. I think that the plan is a wise one. It gives the opportunity to have a vacation of from four to six weeks during the latter part of the winter or early spring when the traveling and weather conditions are likely to be the worst. In several parts of the district where the plan has been tried it has seemed to work very satisfactorily.

I am glad to report that the per cent of school attendance increased during the past year to about the

average for the whole state. Let me again advise the purchase of galvanized iron jackets for each of the stoves. These jackets are comparatively inexpensive, and they insure a much more even heating of the rooms.
