ARTICLE 4: To see if the District will vote, pursuant to NHRSA 52:5, II, to ratify the decision of the Hillsborough Selectmen to expand the boundaries of the District to incorporate the following land within the District corporate limits: 4.0 acres or thereabouts of land belonging to the Emerald Lake Village District (Tax Map 9, Lot 50), 20,338 square feet of land belonging to Gerald F. & Catherine Burnham shown as "Parcel B" now annexed to Tax Map 14, Lot 637 and 18,934 square feet of land belonging to Christopher Proulx, et. al., shown as "Parcel A" now annexed to Tax Map 14, Lot 636 as shown on a plan be Donald R. Mellen, surveyor, entitled "Plan of Annexation in Hillsborough, NH, " dated September 21, 2000. (Recommended by the Commissioners)

- ARTICLE 5: To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to establish a part-time position of "Secretary", to perform such lawful functions as the Commissioners may prescribe, under their supervision and direction; and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 to cover costs for said purpose, including salary, insurance, taxes and other associated employment costs. (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 6: To see if the District will vote to appropriate up to the sum of \$ 20,000.00 from the "Unreserved Fund Balance" for the purpose of acquiring land and/or easements by purchase, gift or eminent domain and associated legal and survey costs, to secure to the extent possible, the required sanitary radius for the Hummingbird well (a/k/a Well #1) and to authorize the Commissioners to take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate in connection therewith inclusive of the acquisition of Parcels known as Map 15, Lot 23 & Lot 24. (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 7: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the Emerald Lake Arts Council.(Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 8: To see if the District will vote to appropriate a sum up to the amount of \$30,000.00 to be withdrawn from the "New Well Capital Reserve" for the

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purpose of preliminary siting a new well and acquiring sufficient land to access said well & provide for the required sanitary radius & appropriate wellhead protection by gift, purchase or eminent domain, and to authorize the Commissioners to take any action in connection therewith inclusive of the acquisition in whole or in part, of parcels known as Tax Map 6, Lot 89; Tax Map 13, Lot 279, 193 and 194. (Recommended by the Commissioners)

ARTICLE 9: To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$45,000.00 to be withdrawn from the "Water Main Installation & Reconstruction Capital Reserve" for the purpose of installing a main from the Mary Rowe Well to the Meetinghouse Well. (Recommended by the Commissioners)

- ARTICLE 10: To see if the District will vote to appropriate up to the sum of \$20,000.00 from the "Unreserved Fund Balance" for the purpose of acquiring parcels of land known as Tax Map 15, Lot 52; Map 16, Lots 46, 63, 73, 86, 109, 190 & 273 should they be auctioned by the Town and to authorize the Commissioners to take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate in connection therewith inclusive of the conveyance in whole or in part of these lots on such terms and conditions they deem appropriate. The purpose of acquiring these lots is to minimize growth and demands on District services by ownership or merging them with and conveying them to abutters. (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 11: To see if the District will vote to appropriate the total sum of up to \$50,000.00 for the purpose of water quality improvements, and of this amount to withdraw the sum of \$20,000.00 from the "Pump & Equipment Upgrade Capital Reserve", with the remaining sum of \$30,000.00 to come from the "Unreserved Fund Balance". (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 12: To see if the District will vote discontinue "Berry Patch Lane" and to authorize the Commissioners to convey the freehold to its abutters as requested on such terms and conditions the Commissioners deem appropriate, reserving all existing utility easements. (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 13: To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners on behalf of the District, to accept property given to the District upon such terms or conditions that they consider to be in the best interests of the District, or take any other action in relation thereto. Prior to accepting any property pursuant to this authority, the Commissioners shall conduct two noticed public hearings as required by RSA 41:14-a, paragraph I. (Recommended by the Commissioners)
- ARTICLE 14: To see if the residents of Emerald Lake Village District would vote to establish a condition of holding the office as a "District Commissioner", that at least one (1) Commissioner shall attend a regular scheduled meeting of the Hillsboro Selectmen's Business Session at least once (1) per month. Required attendance is for the purpose of conveying any concerns put forth

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by the residents of Emerald Lake Village District that is/are the responsibility of the Elected or Appointed officials of the Town of Hillsboro. The Commissioner(s) is to report back to the resident(s) the disposition of such concern expressed. Petitioned Warrant Article. (Not Recommended by the Commissioners)

ARTICLE 15: To transact such other business as may properly come before the Meeting.


