Warrant for Annual Meeting

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Boston on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To bring in your ballots upon the question as to whether the amendment proposed by the Convention to revise the Constitution shall be approved.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the improvement of highways, or act in relation thereto.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same: (A) For the support of schools; (B) For repairing roads and bridges; (C) For the maintenance of the poor; (D) For Memorial Day; (E) For all other necessary town charges.
- 5. To see what action the town will take in regard to the purchase of a Road Roller, new or second-hand; raise and appropriate money for the same; or pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Library, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to sewers and sewage; raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.

- 8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to install and maintain a public watering tub, in some convenient location in New Boston village; raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
- 10. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for the use of the Farm Bureau to continue the dental work in the schools, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Community Playground, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the care of the Soldiers' Monument, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
- 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to free use of the Town Hall for Community Meetings, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 14 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of co-operating with the State and Federal Government in control of the White Pine Blister Rust, or act in relation thereto.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to insurance for town property; raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take in regard to disposing of a portion of the Town Dump, in order to simplify and straighten the boundary lines thereof; or act in relation thereto.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take relating to unused schoolhouses.

- 18. In view of the 300th Anniversary of the Settlement of the State which occurs this year; to see what action, if any, the Town will take in regard to "Old Home Week," raise and appropriate money for the same, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Junk Licenses, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 20. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and other officers heretofore chosen, or act in relation thereto.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Proceedings of Annual Meeting

March 14th, 1922

At a legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, on the second Tuseday of March, 1922, at the Town House in said town, at nine o'clock in the forenoon. The meeting was called to order, and the warrant therefor was read by William O. Dodge, Moderator, and before the transaction of any business the Supervisors of the Checklist took and subscribed on the back of the checklist to be used at said meeting the oath prescribed by section Nine, Chapter thirty-two of the Public Statutes.

Prayer by the Rev. Louis W. Swanson.

Town Clerk.

The whole number of tickets given in for town clerk was thirty-six (36) upon which one was blank, Charles Marden had six, Charles F. Marden had twenty-nine, and the said Charles F. Marden having a majority of all the votes cast was declared elected by the moderator, and in open meeting took the oath of office by law prescribed.

Selectman for three years.

The whole number of tickets given in for selectman was twenty-five (25) upon which: Charles H. Sargent had one vote, Herbert M. Christie had two votes, Thomas E. Cochran had three votes, George A. Warren had nineteen votes, and the said George A. Warren having a majority of all the votes cast was declared elected by the moderator, and in open meeting took the oath of office by law prescribed.

Treasurer

The whole number of tickets given in for Treasurer was twenty-five (25) upon which Thomas E. Cochran had two votes, Joseph Rockingham had six votes, Joseph H. Rockingham had seventeen votes, and the said

Joseph H. Rockingham was declared elected by the moderator.

Collector of Taxes

Voted, to neglect to choose, the selectmen to advertise for bids, and award the office to the lowest responsible bidder.

Library Trustee for three years

The whole number of tickets given in for Library Trustee was thirteen (13), upon which Clarissa P. Blanchard had one vote, Addie E. Edwards had one vote, Charles F. Marden had eleven votes and the said Charles F. Marden was declared elected by the moderator.

Cemetery Trustee

On motion of C. H. Coleman, the Clerk was instructed to cast one vote for Arthur W. Holt as Trustee of the Cemetery and he was declared elected by the moderator.

Trustee of Trust Funds for three years

The whole number of tickts given in for Trustee was six, upon which George H. Mansfield had one vote, Thomas E. Cochran had one vote and Luther D. Colburn had four votes and was declared elected by the moderator and in open meeting took the oath of office by law prescribed.

Fire Wards

By major vote, chose Alvin P. Smith, Brainard P. Newton and Fred C. Brown Fire Wards.

Auditors

By major vote, chose Thomas E. Cochran and George D. Marden, auditors and in open meeting they took the oath of office by law prescribed.

Constable

Several were chosen and declined to serve as constable. Then voted, to neglect to choose.

Highway Surveyors

Voted, that the selectmen appoint not less than twenty-five and not more than thirty-five.

Surveyors of Lumber, Wood and Bark Voted, that the selectmen appoint.

Hog Reeves

Chose John B. Bartlett, Willis C. Hill and Arthur E. Hill.

Money

- A. Support of Schools. Voted, to indefinitely postpone.
- B. Maintenance of the Poor. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars.
- C. Repairing Roads and Bridges. Voted, to lay the rest of article two upon the table and take up article four.

Article 4. Voted, not to accept state aid, and return to article two.

- C. For repairing of roads and bridges, voted to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-nine hundred and ninety dollars.
- D. For Memorial Day. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-five dollars, and that Corporal Arthur E. Hill be a committee to receive, expend and account for the same.
- E. For all other necessary town charges. Voted, to indefinitely postpone.

Recess

Voted, a recess until fifteen minutes past one o'clock in the afternoon, and at said time called to order.

Library

Article Three. Voted, that we raise the sum of three hundred dollars, and appropriate in addition, that part of two hundred dollars necessary to pay rent.

Road Machines

Aricle Five. Voted, not to buy a heavy road ma-

chine. Voted to leave the matter of buying one or more road machines to the selectmen.

Fire Truck

Article Six. Voted, to pass by.

Free Use of Town Hall

Article Seven. Voted, to lay article seven on the table and pass to article seventeen.

Article Seventeen. Voted, that any meeting to which the general public of this community is invited without the payment of an admission fee or any fixed charge, shall have the free use of the Town Hall.

Article Seven. Voted, the American Legion the free use of the Town Hall twelve times or once a month during the calendar year.

Watering Tub

Article Eight. Voted, not to install a tub.

Play Ground

Article Nine. Voted, to abate the tax on playground this year.

Authorize the Selectmen

Article Ten. Voted, that the Selectmen be granted the authority asked for.

White Pine Blister Rust

Article Eleven. Voted, to appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars for the purpose of said article.

Dental Work in Schools

Article Twelve. Voted, to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, so much to be used for the purpose of said article as may be necessary.

Street Light

Article Twelve and one-half. Voted, to indefinitely postpone.

Junk Licenses

Article Thirteen. Voted, to leave the same to the selectmen.

Old Home Week

Article Thirteen and one-half. Voted, to indefinitely postpone.

Fire Alarm

Article Fourteen. Voted, to indefinitely postpone.

Snow Scraper

Article Fifteen. Voted, to leave the matter to the selectmen.

Soldiers Monument

Article Sixteen. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars, to be placed in the hands of the selectmen to be used for the proper care of the monument.

Reports

Article Eighteen. Voted, that the reports of town officers as printed be accepted and adopted.

Other Business

Article Nineteen. Voted, that the monument committee be requested to make necessary corrections to the tablet of monument and that the selectmen reimburse the committee out of the town treasury.

Voted, to adjourn at 3.25 p. m.

Report of School Board

To the Selectmen of New Boston and the Inhabitants of the School District:

The school board of the District of New Boston respectfully submit the following report of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1922.

During the past year we have had to make more minor repairs than we expected. We shingled one side of the house at No. 4 and the shed at No. 2. The ceiling in the lower rooms at No 8 showed such strong symptoms of coming down that we felt we must put up steel ceilings. This has made a permanent improvement and adds very much to the appearance of the rooms. We also feel that the ceiling in the upper part of the house and all of the side wall should be done this summer vacation, as the plaster is loose, keeping everything covered with a fine white dust. When we remember that there are ninety or more boys and girls going in and out of this building every day we can understand why it comes to need repairing and when we consider that our boys and girls spend thirty-six weeks out of the year in these same rooms it seems we should try and have them as comfortable and pleasant as possible.

The building at No. 5 has had the lighting changed, a Kaustine toilet installed and the ceiling whitened. It will need the wood work painted, a new floor is badly needed, and the outside of the house needs painting; also at No. 4 the chimney should be rebuilt as it is so short, it bothers badly smoking.

We think now that we have the community playground for the pupils that we should vote a small sum to improve the grounds around the No. 8 building which will make a decided improvement in the appearance of our village street. There seems to be an ever increasing demand for some kind of a business or agricultural course in our high school for those who do not desire to continue their studies after they graduate. Principal Smith thinks it can be arranged and we would recommend that a start be made in this direction next September.

We also wish to thank the people of the district for their cooperation during the past year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Goffstown, N. H., February 15, 1923. To the School Board and Citizens of New Boston:

The schools for the past year have been practically the same as for the preceding year. At the present time, work is carried on in the same buildings, No. 2, No. 4, No. 5, No. 8, No.13, No.15, No.16. Of the ten teachers now teaching four have previously taught in the town.

For the most part the buildings are in fair condition. Minor repairs, such as fixing floors, windows, locks, bookcases, doors, shelves, toilets, painting, are required every year. However, the building at the village should have particular attention before the opening of school next fall. The walls should be fixed so as to prevent the continuous falling of plaster; the blackboard, cracked and uneven, should be replaced; the antiquated double seats should give way to single adjustable ones. These new seats can be used in the New Building when it comes.

Since the Village Building takes care of half of the pupils of the entire town, and since it will necessarily be in use for some time, it should be put in the best possible condition.

In educational programs the matter of the pupils' health has been receiving increased attention for several years. Light, heat, ventilation, cleanliness of the buildings, proper toilet facilities, are thought of now not as ends in themselves, but as means to provide a favorable environment, which may help to establish the child in ways and habits of health. Medical inspection has been provided for all the pupils of the town by Dr. S. Fraser. This may amount to nothing at all, or it may amount to a great deal. If the examining physician reports certain ailments or defects, which can and should be remedied, and the parent does nothing about

it, there is nothing more the school authorities can do. Negligence may mean ill-health for the child. But neither the physician nor the School Board can compel any action on the part of the parent, even though it might be for the good of the child.

For the second year, the Dental Clinic has been conducted. It is to be hoped this will continue. This work will surely receive the cooperation of the School Board, teachers, and superintendents as in the past.

Now and then with recurring regularities some taxpayer discovers that the schools cost an "outrageous lot." Schools do cost. Anything worth having costs. Necessities cost. But it is well to note a few items. Sometimes it is thought that the "overhead" is unwarranted. Taking the state as a whole, more is paid for janitor services than for supervision. Two necessary items in every school are "Books" and "Supplies." "Books" includes all the books furnished for the pupil's use. Taking the state as a whole, last year the "Average" spent for books per pupil was \$1.48. But on the basis of the figures in last year's school report, New Boston spent for books \$1.28. That is, New Boston spent \$.20 less than the average. As to "Supplies." "Supplies" includes paper of all kinds, composition books, pencils, pens, rulers, chalk, etc. The average spent for every pupil in the state last year was \$1.80, but New Boston spent \$1.48, or \$.32 per pupil less than the average. More than one teacher has been handicapped by lack of sufficient and proper books. is a matter that can be and should be remedied.

I acknowledge with appreciation the cooperation of the members of the School Board, and teachers, and others who have helped me as I have entered upon the duties of superintendent.
