THE TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 P. M. to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for interest on same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the Northwood Public Libraries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,250.00 for Recreation as asked for by the Recreation Committee.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Band Concerts. (Article inserted by Budget Committee).

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of Cemeteries.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used to cut brush on Town Highways.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$554.48 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$3,696.53.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purpose of constructing 2230 feet of new Road as laid out by the Selectmen at the head of Pleasant Lake, leading from Rte. 107 to the Gulf Road so called.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 in addition to the joint T.R.A. fund.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$380.00 for the Concord Hospital.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used, at the discretion of the Selectmen, to support the work of the State Cancer Commission.

15. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$14,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck to be paid as follows:

(a) Transfer from the Fire Department Account, the unexpended \$1,000.00 raised and appropriated in 1964 for repairs to the Narrows Fire Truck.

(b) \$4,500.00 to be raised and appropriated in 1965.

(c) \$8,500.00 to be borrowed by the Town under the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, R.S.A. chapter 33:3 and amendments thereto, \$4,250.00 of which is to be raised and appropriated with interest during 1966 and \$4,250.00 to be raised and appropriated with interest during 1967.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 to establish a Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of purchasing a new Fire Truck, as provided for in R.S.A. Chapter 35:1:3:5.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to install and maintain a 3500 Lumen Mercury Light between the present 1000 Lumen Incandescent Light in front of the Congregational Church and the present 1000 Lumen Incandescent Light at the West Driveway of Coe-Brown Academy.

(The above Article is by petition.)

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Merrimack Valley Regional Association.

20. To see if the Town will vote to have the Road Agent appointed by the Selectmen of Northwood and to be under their direct supervision.

(The above article is by petition and the petitioners request that the vote be by Yes and No Ballot.)

21. To transact any other business that legally may come before the said meeting.

One change in the school staff took place this year as Mr. J. Donald Snodgrass replaced Mr. Percy Gardner as Teaching-Principal of the school. Mr. Snodgrass has had successful teaching experience in both elementary and secondary schools as well as having been a Teaching-Principal in Epsom.

The school program is functioning efficiently under the able administration of Principal Snodgrass and the continuity of the educational program again benefited by the low teacher turnover.

This year, supervisory conferences have been held each month with the principals and assistant superintendent. These meetings enable the principal to share teaching techniques and to learn from each other. The benefit of these conferences can be seen as each principal adopts and implements suggestions to his own school program.

The projected enrollment indicates a substantial increase of pupils in grades five, six, seven and eight, and it is recommended that an additional teacher be engaged to teach in this area. Sound education cannot be achieved by having two grades in a classroom which, in effect, doubles the teacher's responsibility. By providing an addi-

tional teacher, single grades in each room can be achieved which will give all the pupils an equal educational opportunity.

In conclusion, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation given to us during the year by the citizens, school board, faculty and pupils of Northwood.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Town of Northwood

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The school year of 1963-64 saw many children absent because of their having German measles and/or whooping cough. However, with these exceptions, I feel that the Northwood Elementary School had a very good health report.

As part of the school health service, a routine health inspection of all students was made. The parents were informed whenever defects were found, and practically all of these children were seen or treated by their own physicians. The success of the health program depends upon such excellent cooperation as the parents of Northwood have shown.

The following summary lists the tests and examinations done by the school nurse, the defects found, the number of corrected cases, as well as the number of cases of communicable diseases:

A clinic for Tuberculosis Patch Testing was held on January 13, 1964 at which time 173 students and 9 adults (teachers and cooks) were tested. There was 1 positive reaction and this individual was x-rayed.

Three pupils were referred to the New Hampshire Sight Conservation Program for eye examinations. Glasses were provided for two of these children.

One child was referred to the New Hampshire Crippled Children's Service for evaluation of a hearing loss, and from there was sent to Boston for further testing.

The annual pre-school clinic was held in May and was attended by 24 children. Each child was given a routine health inspection by the nurse. Parents were then informed of any defect noted at this time.

During the year 32 home visits were made.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, Mr. Smith, the School Board, teachers, parents and students for their constant cooperation.
