THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Rumney in the county of Grafton in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be nesessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways in addition to the amount required by law.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of the library.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day and choose a committee to expend the same.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
- 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Common.
- 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500. to secure \$7,500. from the state for trunk line construction.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.53 to secure \$801.06 from the state for state aid maintenance.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,038.67 to secure \$4,077.33 from the state for trunk line maintenance.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 117 Laws of 1917 on a section of the Moosilauke Road so called and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of \$200. for this purpose.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200. for Rumney Band.
- 14. To see what action the town will take in regard to the white pine blister rust and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to accept the Charter of the C. D. Hall Post, G. A. R., and keep the same in a conspicuous place in the town library.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all taxes paid before August first.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory blanks distributed at the time of taking appraisal of property.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of uncollected taxes.
- To see what action the town will take in regard to any unexpended balances of special appropriations now in the hands of the town treasurer.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
