School Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne: •

Herewith is presented the annual report.

The report of the past year is one of steady progress. The enrollment was Boys 15, Girls 14, total 29. The percent of attendance was 96.45 and the State average was 94.57. Four were graduated from Gorham High school. Two are attending this year but we expect to have four or five enter next fall. Grades Seven and Eight are larger this year and we shall exceed our budget for books. We save however on tuition so that we call for \$400 although we shall need more.

The new book cupboard is proving very useful and a set of shelves is needed in the other room which is used in preparing lunches. We expect to shingle one side of the roof in June and call for \$75 for minor repairs to cover any deficit on that account.

The new State road made our travelling easier but has left our building in a hollow. Sometime this may call for changes but it is not necessary at present.

With the largest school in late years we are having a most successful school year.

Again I wish to thank the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne for their continued cooperation.
