

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

# State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the (L. S.) County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid construction.
- 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Trunk Line maintenance.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 87, Section 1, of the Revised Statutes, on a section of the Gorham Hill road, so-called, and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work, the sum of \$100 for this purpose.
- 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriatefor the Public Library.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
- 9. To hear the reports of town officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne: .

Herewith is presented the annual report.

The report of the past year is one of steady progress. The enrollment was Boys 15, Girls 14, total 29. The percent of attendance was 96.45 and the State average was 94.57. Four were graduated from Gorham High school. Two are attending this year but we expect to have four or five enter next fall. Grades Seven and Eight are larger this year and we shall exceed our budget for books. We save however on tuition so that we call for \$400 although we shall need more.

The new book cupboard is proving very useful and a set of shelves is needed in the other room which is used in preparing lanches. We expect to shingle one side of the roof in June and call for \$75 for minor repairs to cover any deficit on that account.

The new State road made our travelling easier but has left our building in a hollow. Sometime this may call for changes but it is not necessary at present.

With the largest school in late years we are having a most successful school year.

Again I wish to thank the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne for their continued cooperation.
