SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

February 1, 1926 to February 1, 1927

As we look back over the past five years we can see that our schools are gradually improving. Attendance is better but there is a chance for more improvement in that respect. Our per cent of attendance last year was 90. This should be increased to 93 or 95. I must again ask all parents to co-operate with us in eliminating unnecessary absence.

We now have more trained teachers than we have ever had before. This will mean increased efficiency in school work. In 1922-23 only one of our teachers was a normal graduate, whereas this year we have six. In 1922-23 six of our teachers had had no experience, and only six weeks of training. This year four are teaching for the first time but three of these are normal graduates Our goal for the future shoud be a normal trained teacher in every school. In fact those entering the service from now on must be either normal graduates or experienced teachers.

In eleven cities and towns in New Hampshire, during the school year 1925-1926 schools were in session 360 half days or more Stewartstown was on this honor roll. There is no reason why we should not have such a record every year. 360 half days of school with 90 per cent of attendance means an average of 324 half days for each pupil as compared with an average of about 280 half days five years ago.

Achievement tests have been given in all schools. These tests show that pupils are generally up to standard in arithmetic, but that a majority of them have not yet attained the standard in reading and language. Reading needs special attention in the rural schools, and material has been placed in the hands of the teachers to aid in this work.

OBJECTIVES FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS:

A fully trained teacher in every school.

95 per cent of attendance.

Promotion based upon standard test results as well as on school record.

Pupils up to grade in every subject.

In closing I wish to thank parents, teachers, pupils and the public as a whole for the cooperation you have given during my five years as superintendent. I trust that this spirit of cooperation will continue and that my successor will find the work as pleasant as I have.
