TRUMP APPROVAL UNCHANGED IN NH; HIGH AWARENESS OF MUELLER INVESTIGATION

DURHAM, NH – New Hampshire residents' assessment of Donald Trump's performance as President is unchanged since April. Just over half of residents continue to say the Mueller investigation is a serious matter that should be fully investigated and few would support Trump firing Robert Mueller, though support for such an action among Republicans has increased.

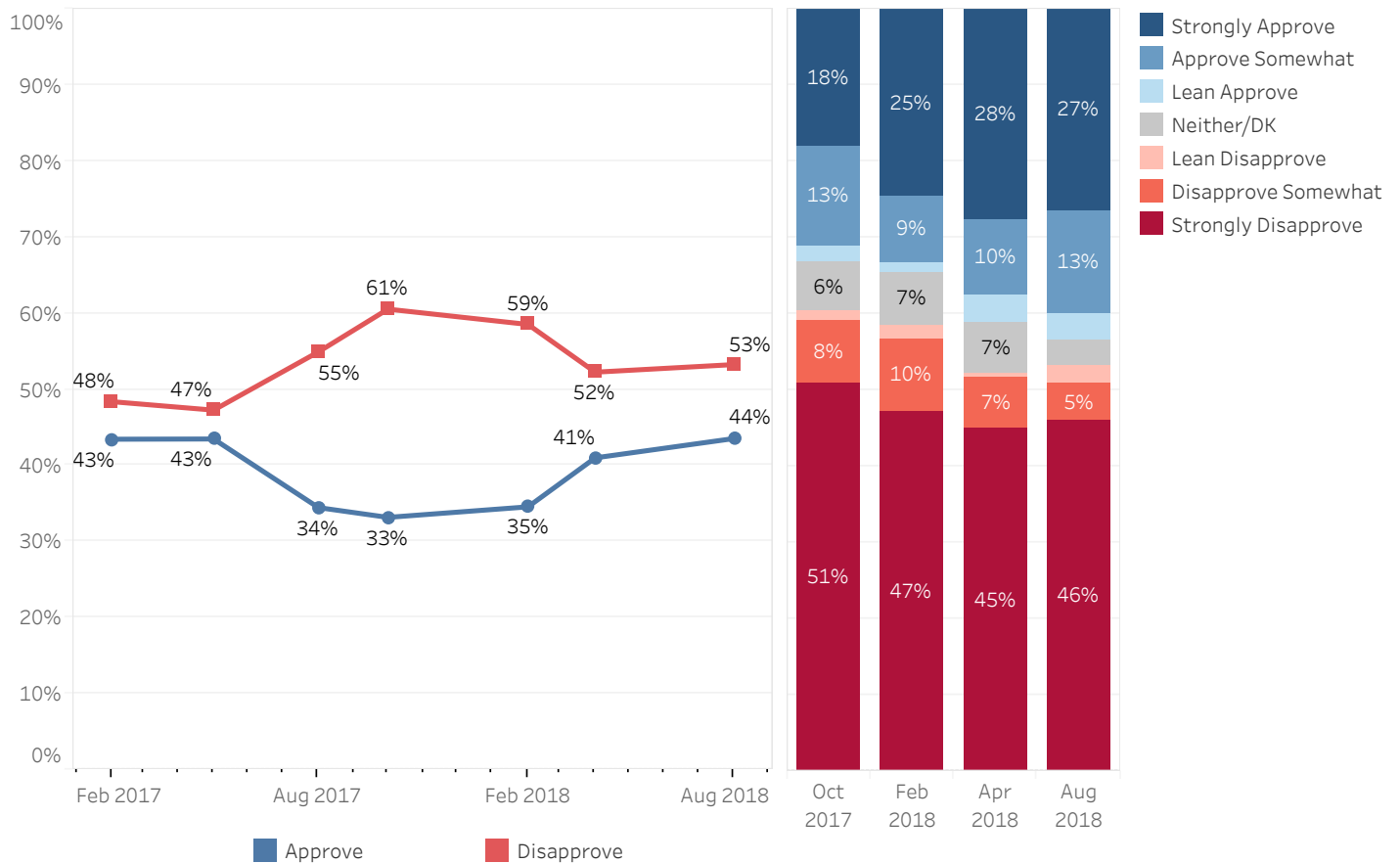
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and one (501) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between August 2 and August 19, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

Presidential Approval

Granite Staters' assessment of Donald Trump's performance as President is unchanged since April. Forty-four percent approve of Trump's performance as president, 53% disapprove, and 3% don't know or are unsure.

"Trump is nearing the 46% level which typically results in reelection," said UNH Survey Center Director Andrew Smith.

Presidential Approval - Donald Trump

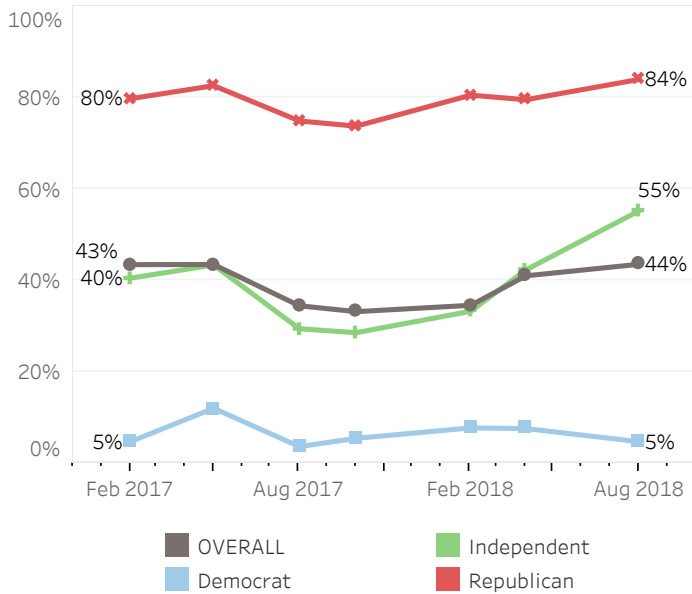

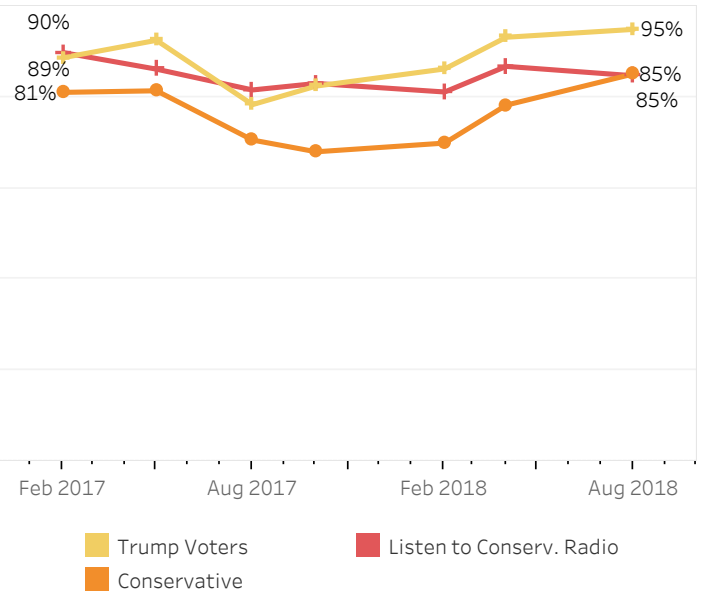
Approval of President Trump is closely tied to partisanship. Eighty-four percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, 55% of Independents approve, up from 42% in February, while only 5% of Democrats approve of Trump's performance as president. Support for Trump among those who voted for him for President in 2016 (95%), among self-described conservatives (85%), and among self-identified Republicans (85%) are at all-time highs.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, conservative talk radio listeners, and those aged 50 to 64 are most likely to approve of Trump's performance. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-identified Democrats, self-described liberals, *Boston Globe* and local newspaper readers, those aged 18 to 49, NHPR listeners, and those who have completed postgraduate work are least likely to approve of Trump's performance.

Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Party Identification

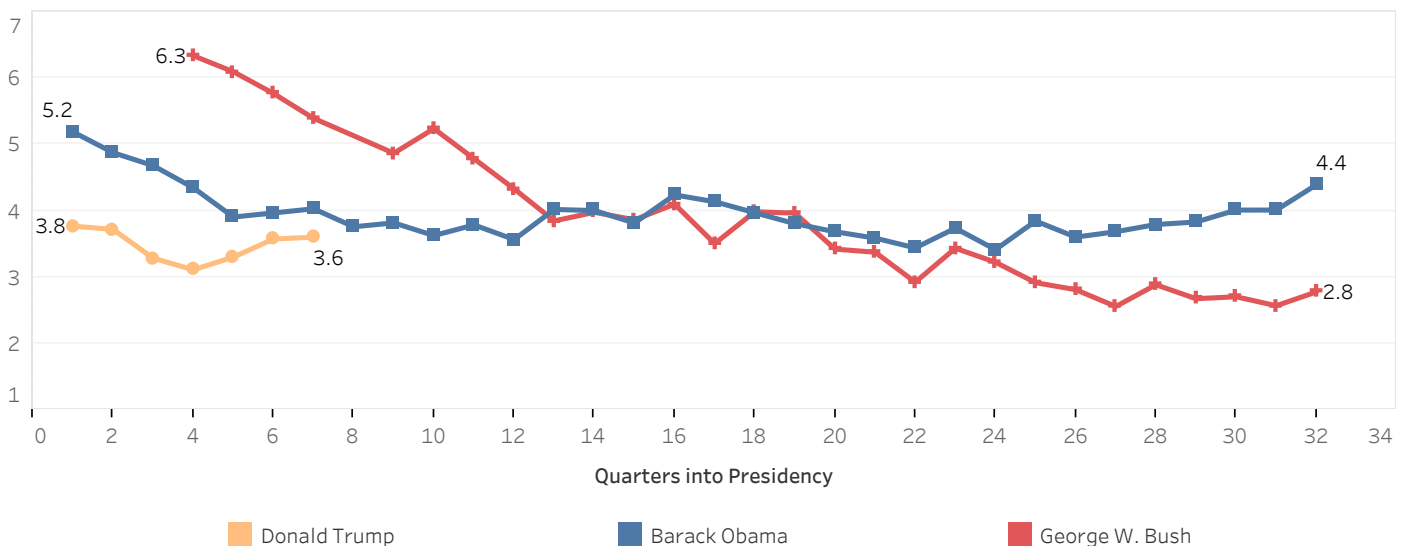


Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Strongest Supporters



On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's average approval rating (3.6) is unchanged since the previous quarter (3.6) but remains below his predecessor, Barack Obama (4.0), in the seventh quarter of his presidency.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)

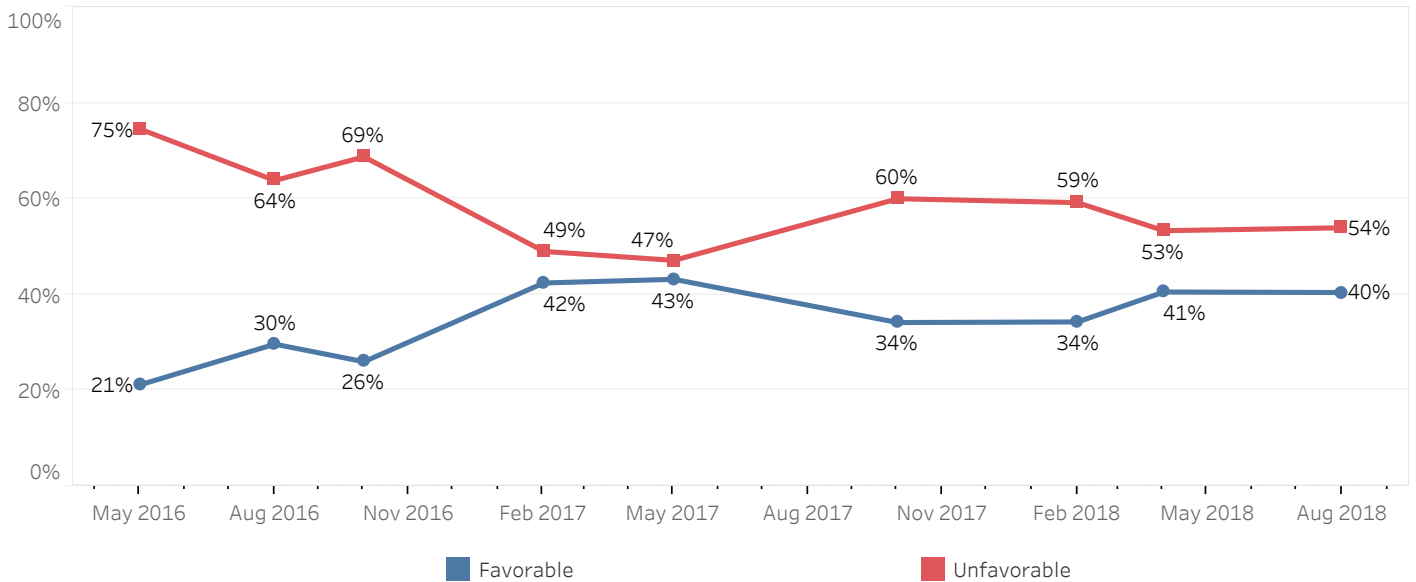


Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

Trump's personal favorability rating among New Hampshire adults is unchanged since April. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 40% of Granite Staters, 54% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6% are neutral or don't know enough to say.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016, conservative radio listeners, self-described conservatives, and self-identified Republicans are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 or did not vote, self-described liberals and moderates, self-identified Democrats, *Boston Globe* and local newspaper readers, and those aged 18 to 34 are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump.

Favorability - Donald Trump

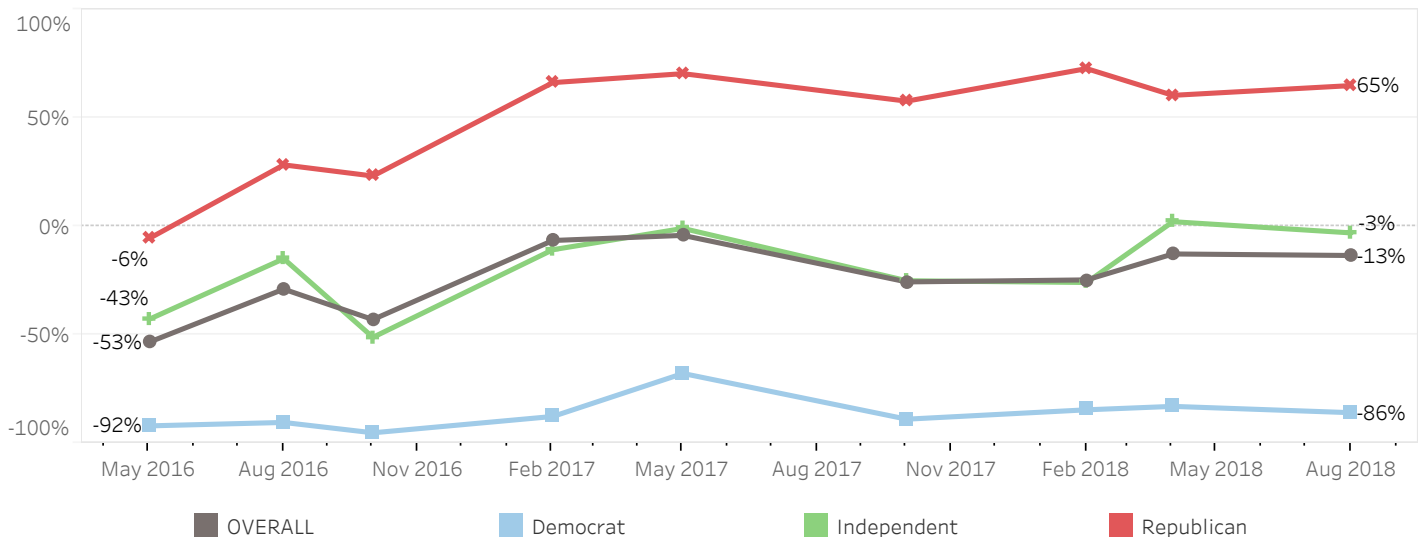


Net Favorability Rating - President Donald Trump

Trump's net favorability rating, the percentage of people who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, remains very low. It currently stands at -13%, unchanged since April (-13%). Trump's popularity among Republicans (+65%), Independents (-3%), and Democrats (-86%) is unchanged since April.

Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump

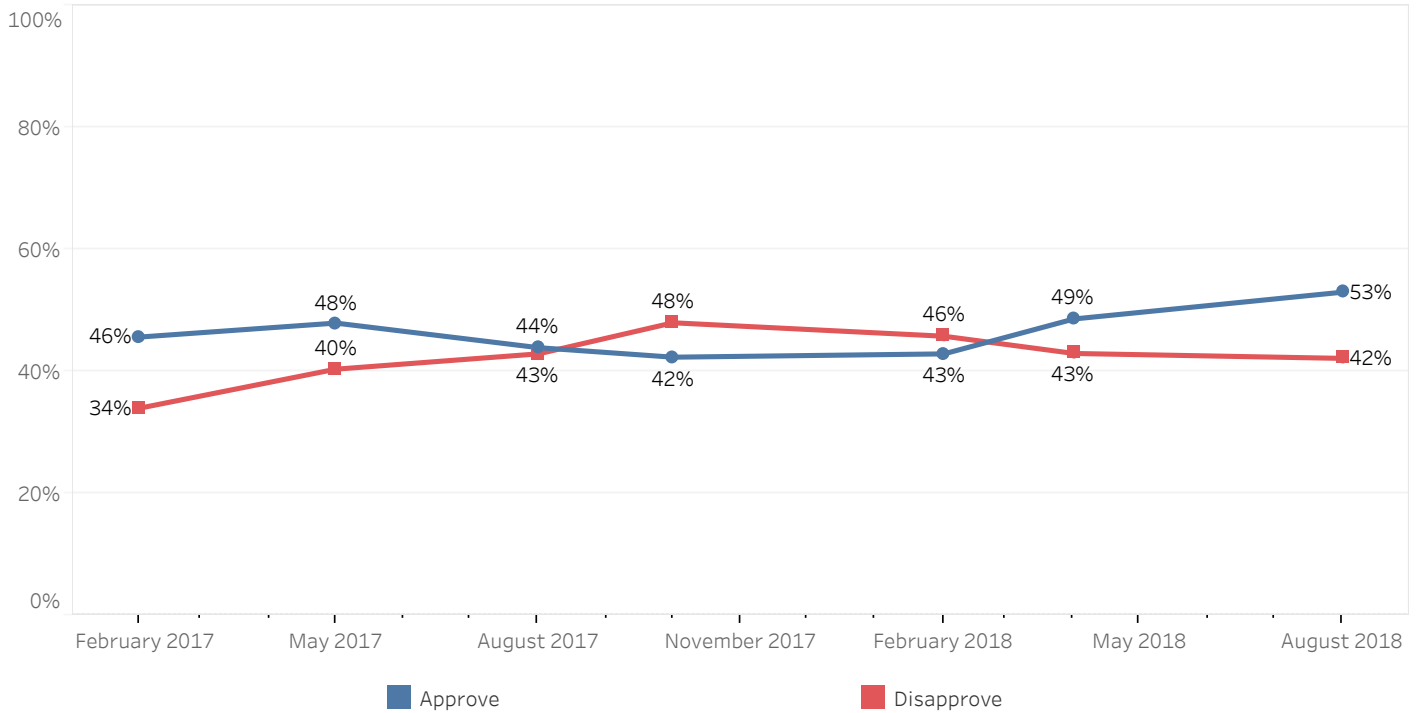
Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)



Economic Approval

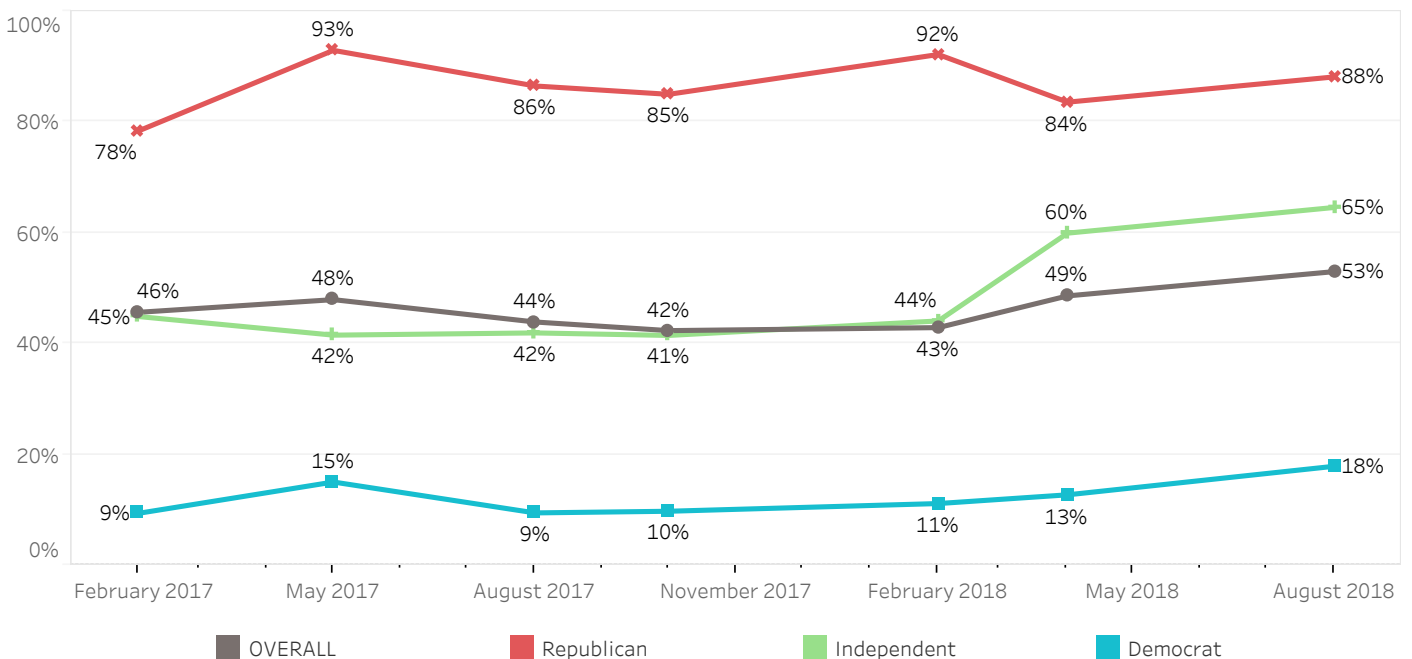
Approval of President Trump's handling of the economy among New Hampshire residents has been increasing since February: 53% of respondents currently approve of his handling of the economy, 42% disapprove, and 5% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. This is the first time in his presidency that more than half of Granite Staters approve of Trump's handling of the economy.

A large majority of Republicans approve of Trump's handling of the economy (88%), as do two-thirds of Independents (65%). However, Democrats (18%) remain much less likely to approve.

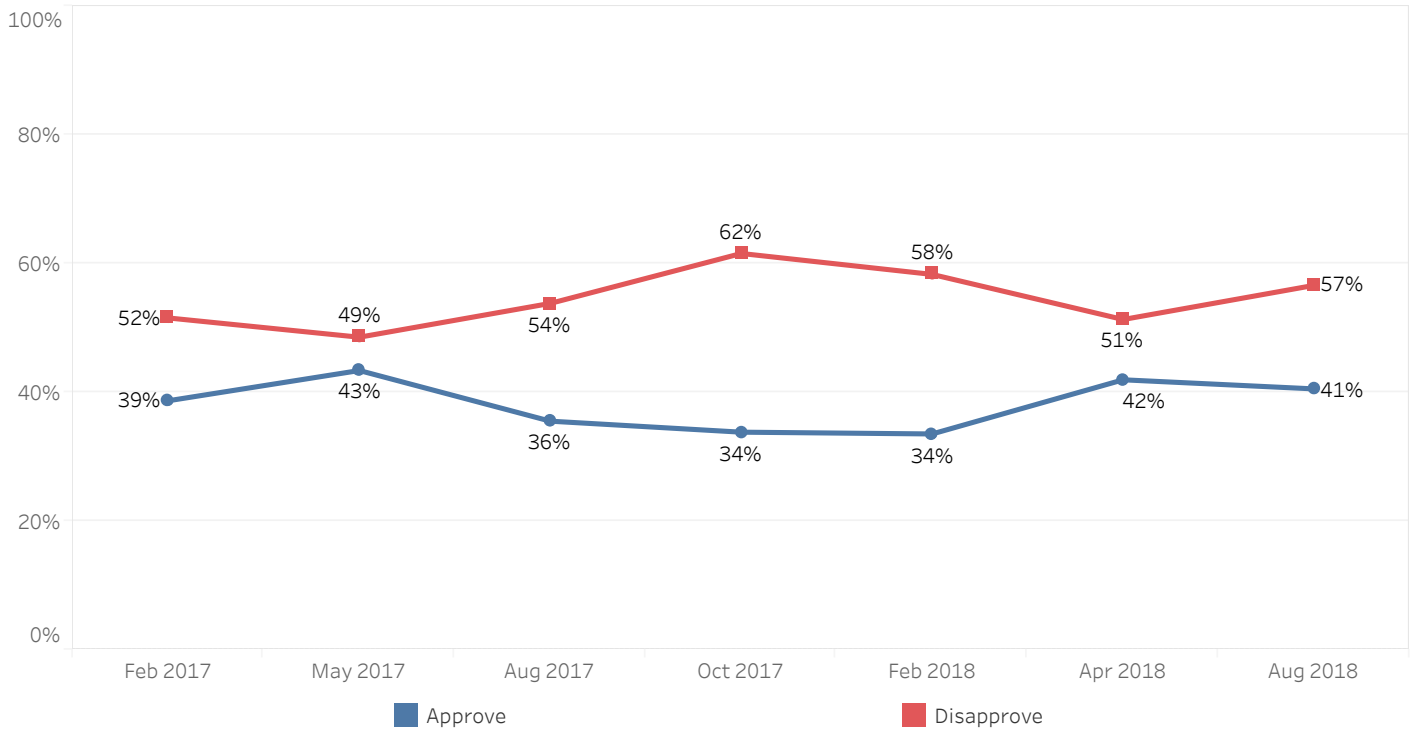
Economic Approval - by Party ID



Foreign Affairs Approval

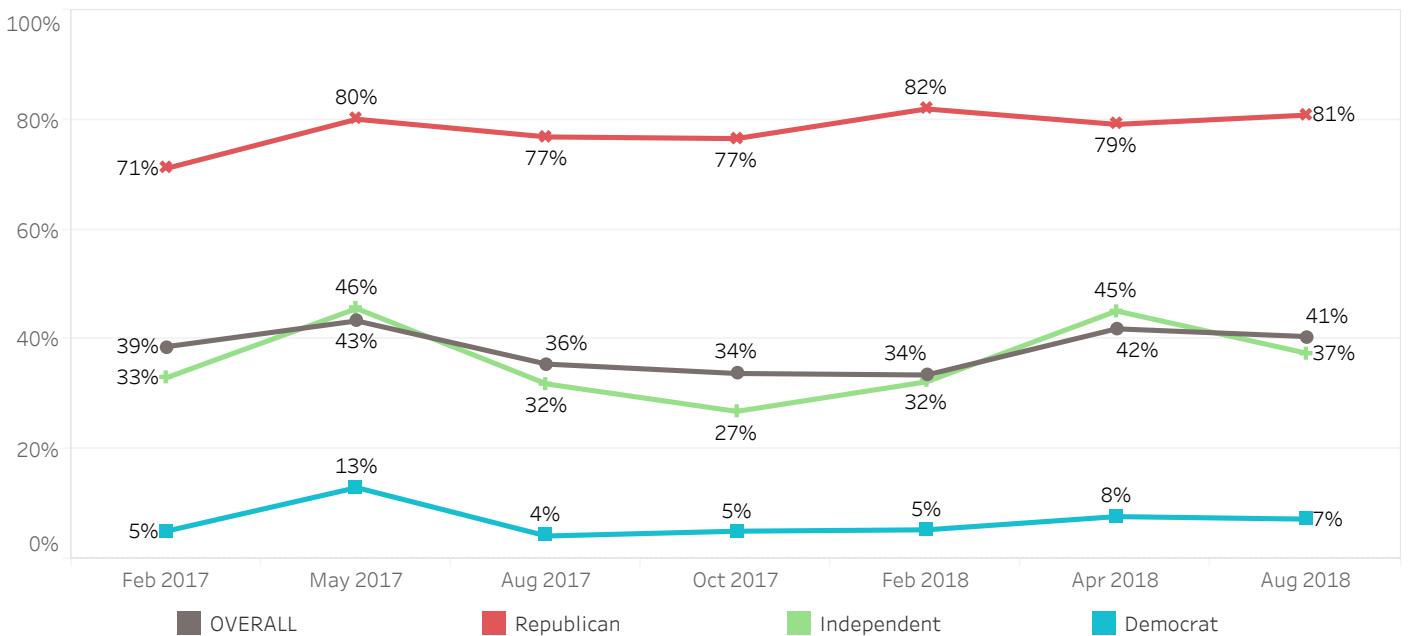
Granite Staters' opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs remains low. Currently, 41% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 57% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

Eighty-one percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance in foreign affairs and 37% of Independents approve, but approval among Democrats remains very low (7%). Opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs has fallen slightly among Independents since April (45% in April, 37% in August).

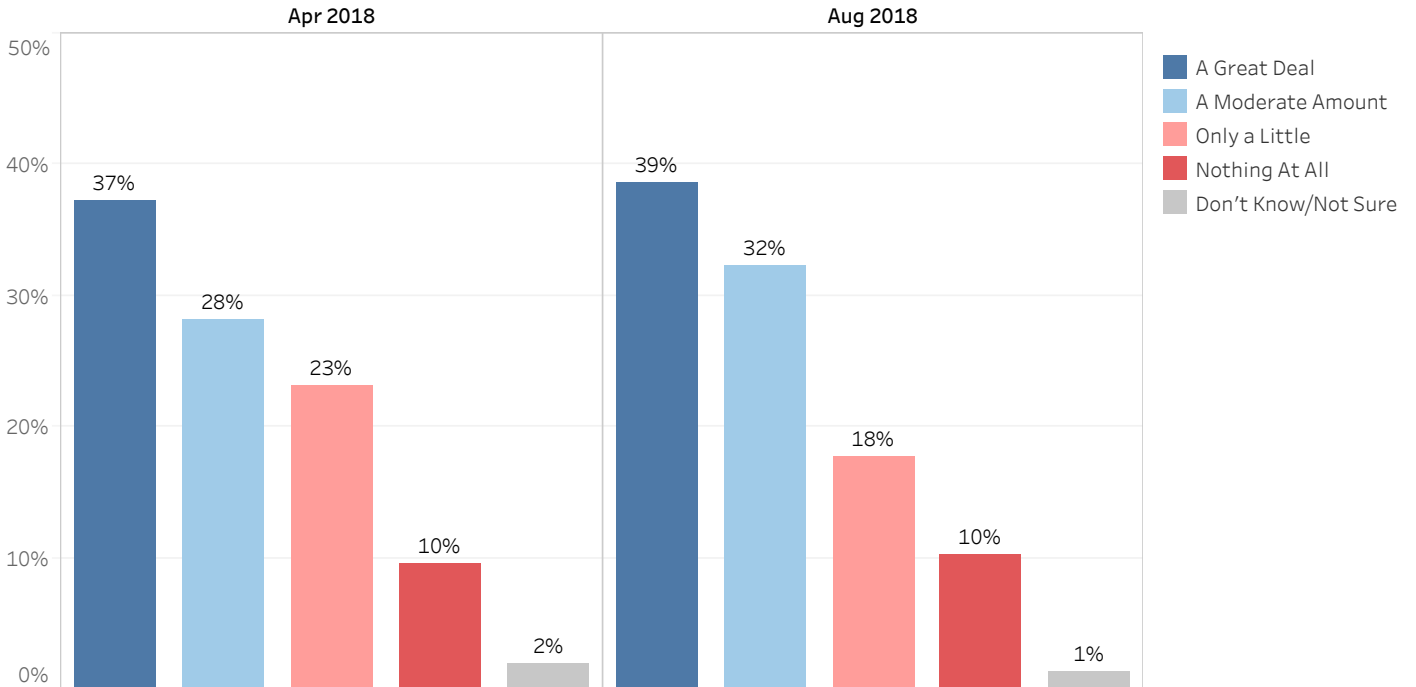
Foreign Affairs Approval - by Party ID



Mueller Investigation

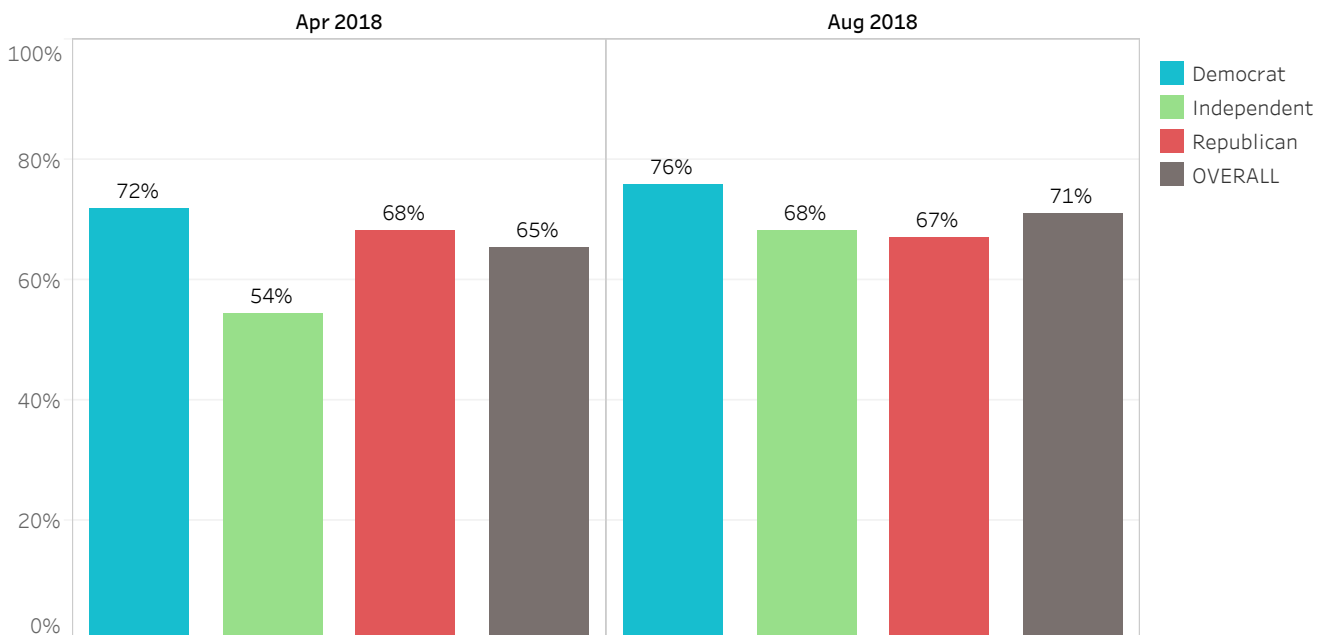
Thirty-nine percent of New Hampshire residents say they have heard a great deal about the investigation led by Robert Mueller to examine Russian efforts to influence the 2016 US presidential election. One-third (32%) say they have heard a moderate amount, 18% have heard only a little, 10% have heard nothing at all, and 1% don't know or are unsure. Awareness of the Mueller investigation is largely unchanged since April.

How Much Heard or Seen About Mueller Investigation



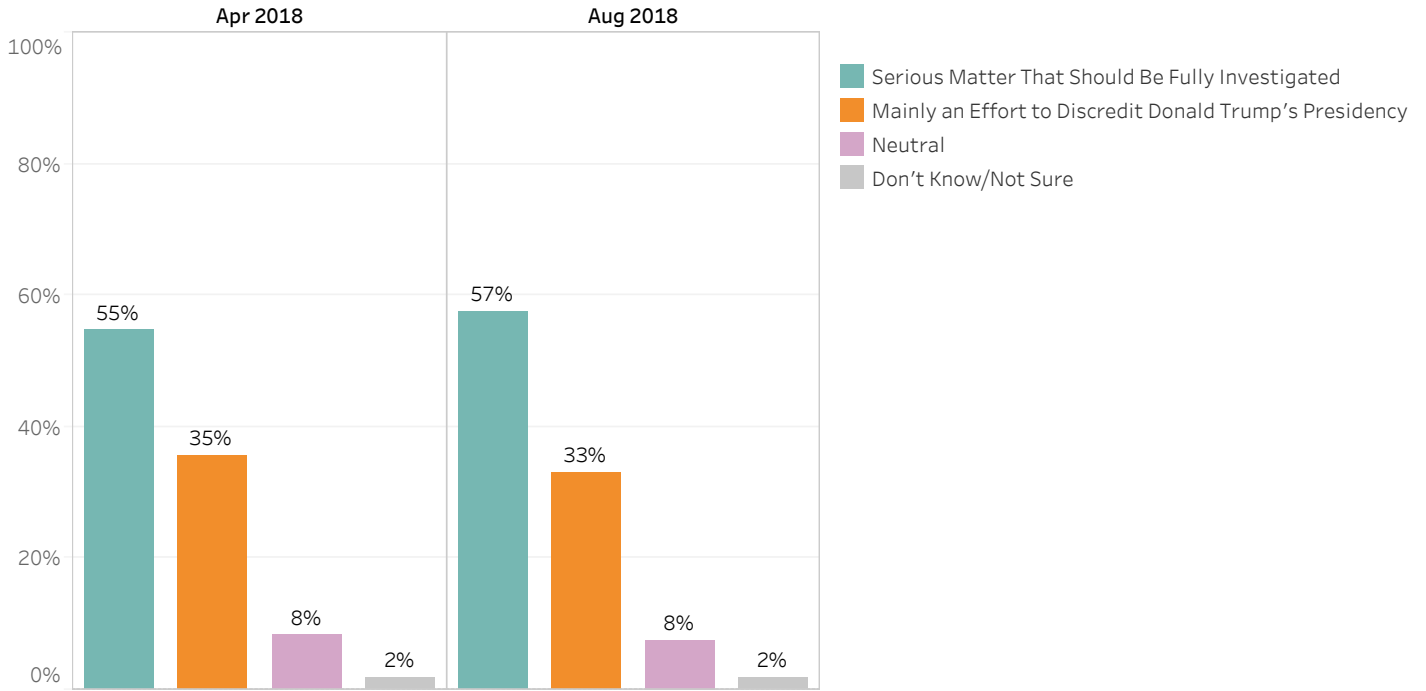
Democrats (76%) are slightly more likely than Independents (68%) and Republicans (67%) to say they have heard a great deal or a moderate amount about the Mueller investigation. However, Independents (68% have heard a great deal or a moderate amount) have become more aware of the investigation since April (54%).

Heard a Great Deal or a Moderate Amount About Mueller Investigation - by Party ID

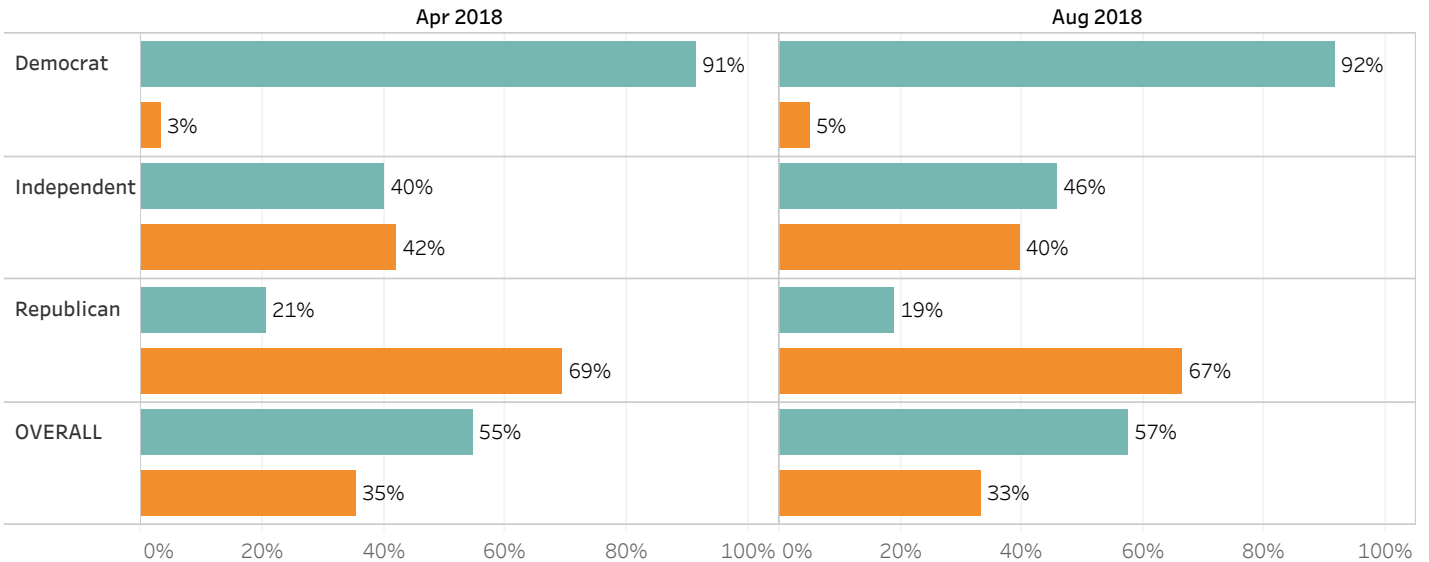


Among those who have heard at least a little about the Mueller investigation (N=442), just over half (57%) say it is a serious matter that should be fully investigated, one-third (33%) say the investigation is mainly an effort to discredit Donald Trump's presidency, 8% are neutral, and 2% don't know or are unsure. Assessment of the Mueller investigation is unchanged since April.

Assessment of Mueller Investigation

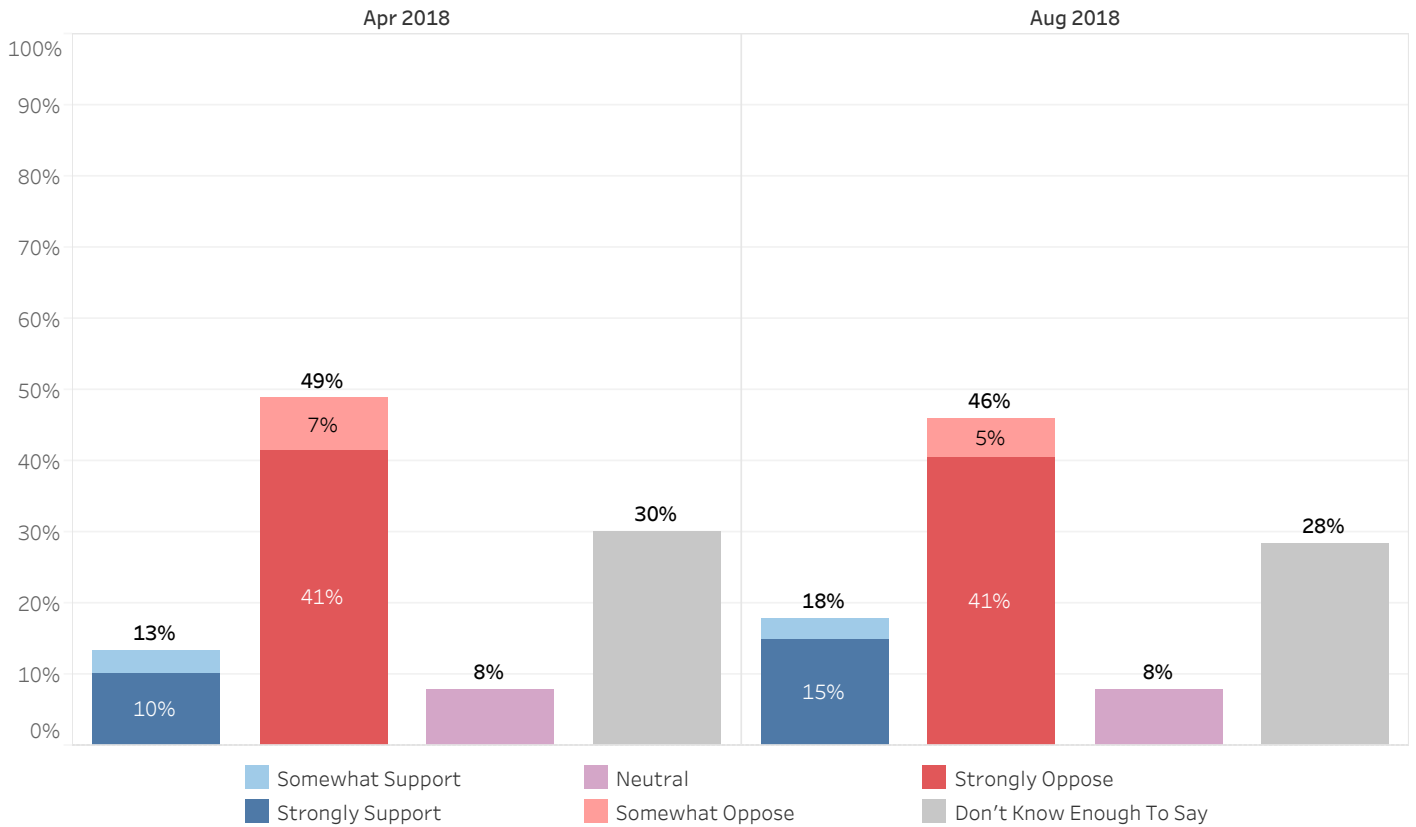


Nearly all Democrats (92%) believe the Mueller investigation is a serious matter that should be fully investigated, while two-thirds of Republicans (67%) say it is mainly an effort to discredit Donald Trump's presidency. A slight plurality of Independents (46%) believe it is a serious matter that should be fully investigated.



There remains very little support for the firing of Robert Mueller by President Trump among those who have heard at least a little about the Mueller investigation. Only 18% say they would strongly (15%) or somewhat (3%) support firing Mueller while nearly half (46%) would strongly (41%) or somewhat (5%) oppose Mueller's firing. Eight percent of respondents are neutral on the issue while 28% don't know enough to say.

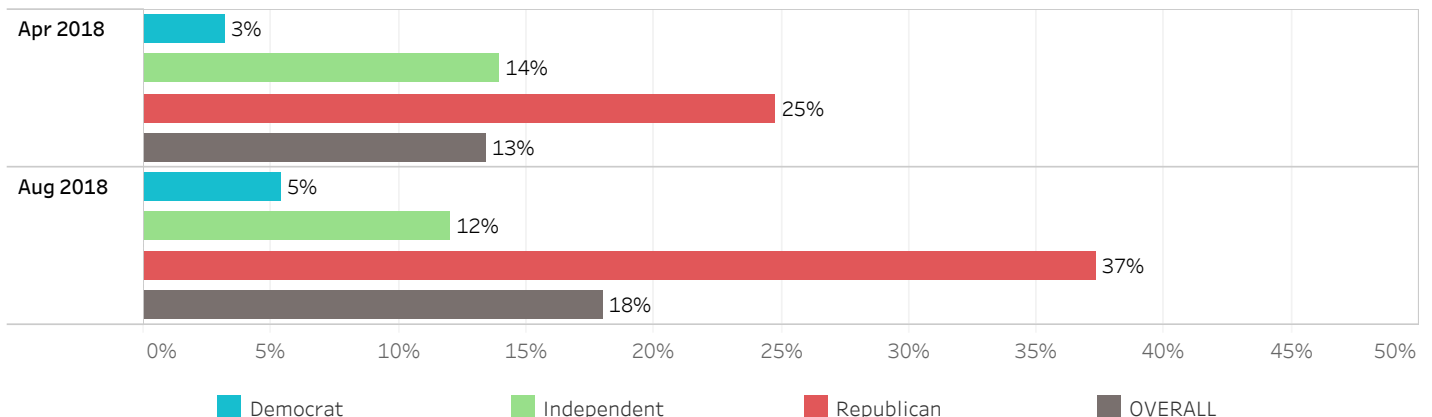
Support/Oppose Trump Firing Mueller



In April, only one-quarter of Republicans (25%) said they would strongly or somewhat support President Trump firing Robert Mueller, while currently 37% would support such an action. Support for firing Mueller among Democrats (5%) and Independents (12%) remains quite low.

Those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, conservative radio listeners, and self-described conservatives are most likely to support President Trump firing Robert Mueller, while those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, NHPR listeners, *Boston Globe* readers, and those aged 65 and older are most likely to oppose it.

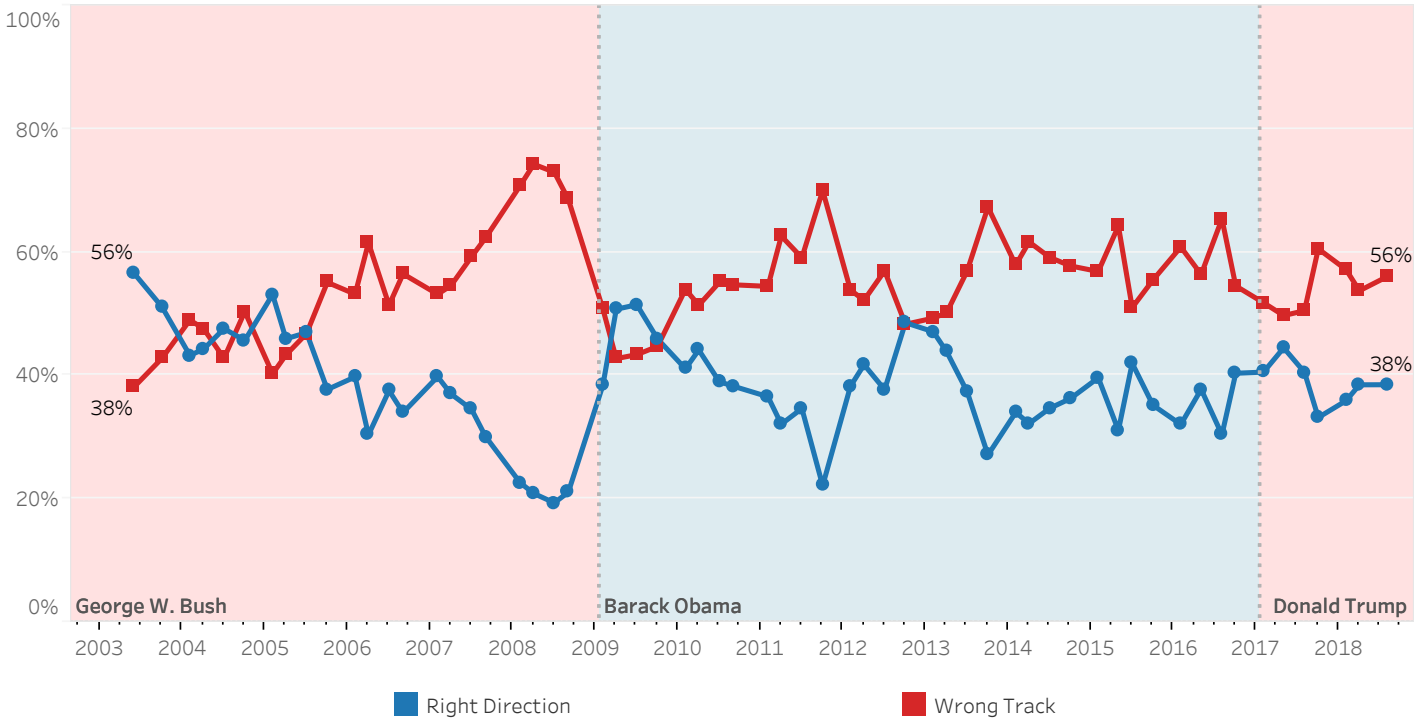
Support/Oppose Trump Firing Mueller - by Party ID



US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

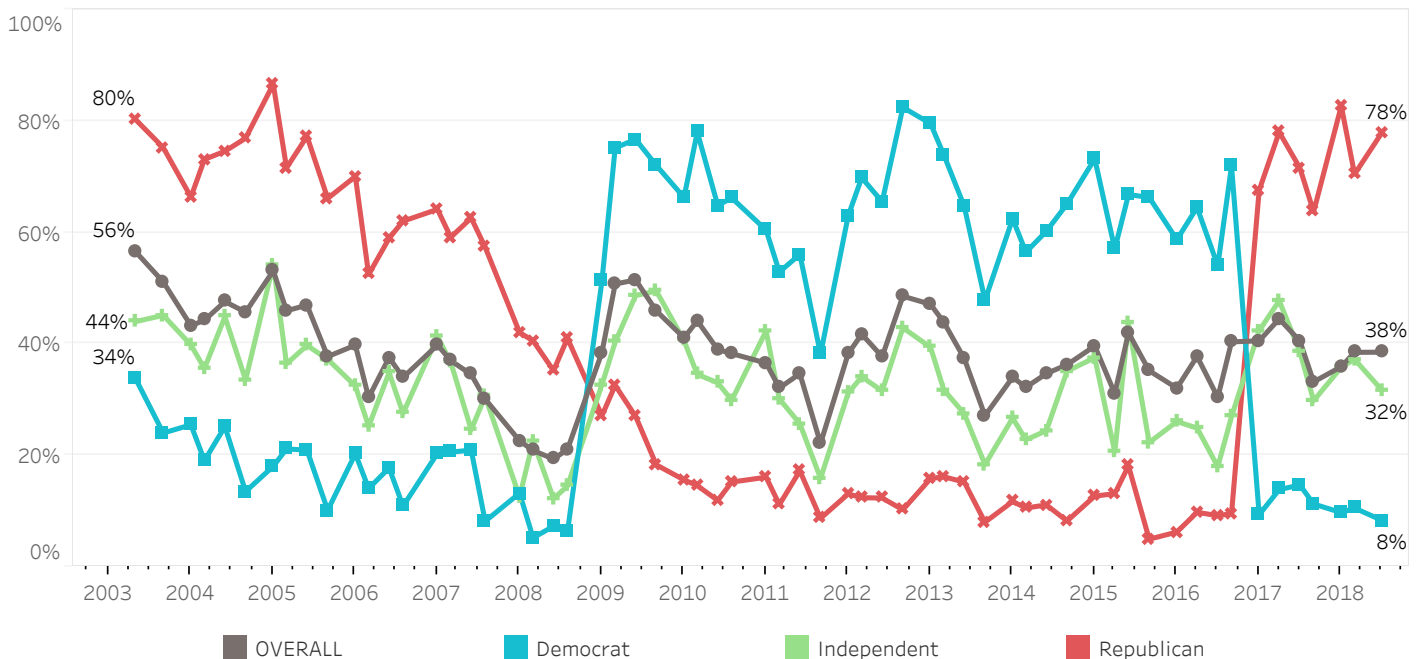
Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be largely pessimistic about the direction of the country. Thirty-eight percent of New Hampshire residents think things in the country are going in the right direction while 56% say things are seriously off on the wrong track and 6% don't know or are unsure. Feelings on this question are largely unchanged since April.

Opinion about the direction of the country remains very closely tied to partisanship. Just over three-quarters (78%) of Republicans believe the country is headed in the right direction but only one-third (32%) of Independents and 8% of Democrats agree. Belief among New Hampshire Democrats that the country is headed in the right direction (8%) is at its lowest point since September of 2008 (6%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and one (501) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between August 2 and August 19, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.3%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
