RECORD OF Special Town Meeting

WEARE, N. H., February 20, 1926.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of Weare on February 20th, 1926, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

The meeting was called to order by Edward T. Breed, Moderator.

ARTICLE 1. Voted, that the Selectmen be authorized to hire the roads ploughed for motor traffic from points, as follows: From the village of Riverdale, thence to East Weare, thence to North Weare, thence to the New Boston line, via South Weare Village; and that a full report as to cost, together with their recommendations, be submitted at the next town meeting.

Voted, that the meeting be dissolved.

Record of Town Meeting

WEARE, N. H., March 27, 1926.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of Weare, on the 27th day of March, 1926, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

The meeting was called to order and the Warrant read by Edward T. Breed, Moderator; also the posting of the checklist by the Supervisors.

Whole number of names on the checklist, 772.

ARTICLE 1. Proceeded to ballot for town officers.

For Town Clerk. The whole number of votes given in was 194, upon which Frank H. Peaslee had 192 and was declared elected by the Moderator and, in open meeting, took the oath of office by Law prescribed.

For Selectman, for three years. The whole number of votes given in was 194, upon which Mabel D. Eastman had 2, Denton Dearborn had 5 and Hiram E. Grant had 171 and was declared elected by the Moderator and, in open meeting, took the oath of office by Law prescribed.

For Road Agents. The whole number of votes given in was 194, upon which Asa E. Felch had 1, Leon A. Reade had 7, Charles E. Bennett had 181, Frank G. Philbrick had 191 and Elwin T. George had 192 and Elwin T. George, Frank G. Philbrick and Charles F. Bennett were declared elected by the Moderator and, in open meeting, Elwin T. George took the oath of office by Law prescribed.

For Overseer of the Poor. The whole number of votes given in was 194, upon which George A. Waterman had

191 and was declared elected by the Moderator and, in open meeting, took the oath of office by Law prescribed.

The Moderator called a recess, until 1.15 P. M.

Met after recess, at 1.15 P. M.

ART. 2. Voted to raise three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to defray town charges.

ART. 3. The Clerk was instructed to cast one vote for Allen W. Sawyer for Trustee of Trust Funds. This being done, the Moderator declared Allen W. Sawyer elected Trustee for three years.

ART. 4. The Clerk was instructed to cast one vote for Lucie E. Clough for Trustee of the Library. This being done, the Moderator declared Lucie E. Clough elected Trustee for three years.

ART. 5. Voted to raise fifty (50) cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation.

ART. 6. Voted to dismiss.

ART. 7. Voted to dismiss.

ART. 8. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways, under the Law passed at the January Session, 1905.

Voted to re-consider the vote passed on Article 8.

Voted to recind the vote taken on Article 8.

Voted to dismiss the Article.

ART. 9. Voted that it be left with the Selectmen to make provision for the collection of taxes.

ART. 10. Voted to raise one hundred dollars (\$100) for the observance of Memorial Day.

ART. 11. Voted to raise four hundred dollars (\$400) for White Pine Blister Rust control.

ART. 12. Voted that it be left with the Selectmen.

ART. 13. Voted to discontinue the road, as stated in the Article, subject to bars or gates.

ART. 14. Voted to dismiss.

ART. 15. Upon motion of Frank N. Sawyer, that the town raise two hundred dollars (\$200) for the benefit of the Weare Base Ball Club. The motion was rejected.

ART. 16. Voted to dismiss.

ART. 17. Voted to raise three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to buy a fire truck and the Selectmen be authorized to purchase the same.

ART. 18. Voted to buy the signal lights erected by the American Gas Accumulator Co. and buy two more, one to be erected at the corner near the North Weare Post Office and one at the corner near A. D. Eastman's Store at South Weare, and raise the sum of thirteen hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$1,325).

ART. 19. Upon motion of Alfred Osborne, not to buy equipment for keeping the roads open to automobile traffic, but to hire it done. This motion was rejected.

Upon motion of Frank N. Sawyer, that the town buy a Mead-Morrison Tractor. This motion was rejected.

Upon motion of Gordon W. Porter, voted that a committee of four act in conjunction with the Selectmen to purchase necessary equipment for keeping the main roads

open to automobile traffic and the amount not to exceed six thousand dollars (\$6,000) be expended.

Voted to raise one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with the interest on the whole amount each year until all is paid.

Voted that the committee of four, to act in conjunction with the Selectmen, be chosen from the floor.

The following named committee was chosen: Edward H. Barrows, Leslie T. Whitney, Elwin T. George and George M. Slack.

ART. 20. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to organize a fire company.

Voted, that the town officers receive four dollars (\$4) per day for their services to the town.

Voted, that the Selectmen furnish the Fire Warden necessary equipment for fighting fires.

Voted that, if electricity comes into town, the Selectmen be authorized to instal lights in the Town Hall and Town Office. Also one or more at each of the villages of Weare Center, North Weare, East Weare and South Weare.

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to attend the hearing in regard to bus line service running through the town. Hearing to be held at Concord, N. H., April 20th

Voted, that this meeting be dissolved.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Weare, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Weare, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock, in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To choose, by separate ballot, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.
4. To choose, by separate ballot, one Trustee of the Library for three years.
5. To see how much money the Town will raise to repair highways.
6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the amount necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways.
7. To make provision for the collection of taxes.
8. To see how much money the Town will appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) for the purpose

of coöperating with the State Government in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust; such appropriation to be available until spent, in coöperation with the State Government.

10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, a piece of old road leading from the main road from South Weare to Deering to the cemetery on Toby Hill.

11. To see if the Town will vote to buy a road machine or grader and raise a sum of money for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to buy a piece of land and build a building to house town property and raise a sum of money for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to sell all or part of the snow rollers owned by the Town.

14. To see if the Town will vote to buy another tractor and snow plow and raise a sum of money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the care of soldiers' graves.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Weare:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report.

Our general record for the past year compares favorably with that of previous years and also with State Standards. The attendance record, like that of the year before, is especially worthy of mention. The honor roll of perfect attendance, for one term or more, shows an impressive total of 122 names, 50 % of the total enrollment of the schools. The record of all schools for the year was 94.68 %. This means that a large majority of the Weare children were attending to their school duties practically all of the time. Practically all of the time, means a full school year. Only 4½ days, out of a possible 180, were lost on account of holidays and other causes: I wish to congratulate all Weare citizens on having so overcome natural conditions, as to make it possible for their children to achieve such remarkable success in school attendance. The children and teachers are also to be congratulated for their whole-hearted coöperation, which gave them a very real share in this achievement.

The New Hampshire State Law provides for a school year of 36 weeks or 180 days of actual school work. Our teachers are employed on this basis and the district pays them for 36 weeks of service. If, then, we lose from our school year more than 4 or 5 days, as a business organization, we are becoming very inefficient. It is not always satisfactory to make up days lost; so a number of school districts in our state are providing for no-school days by adopting a school year of 37 or 38 weeks, thereby getting in from 177 to 183 days of actual school work.

The all-around advantages of the new high school building are enabling us to greatly improve our work. We are now equipped to teach both physics and chemistry according to generally accepted standards.

The Weare High School will always be linked with the personality of its first Headmaster Charles D. Dalzell and with the faithful officials and teachers who carried on with him. I, with you and all citizens of Weare, looked upon his resignation with a deep feeling of personal loss. But today, as the work goes on, we realize more fully, than ever before, the value of his service to the school and community and that his influence will continue as a vital factor in all our activities. His act in recommending Leslie S. Cummings as his successor, was further proof of his abiding interest. Mr. Cummings soon became the choice of all and we are sure that, under his wise leadership, the work, so nobly and well begun, will go on to a larger measure of success in the future.

Our enrollment for the current year is 51, the largest in the history of the school. The Junior High, grades 7 and 8, organized as a part of the High School, was opened September 7th, 1926, with an enrollment of 22, making a total of 73 in the new building. The Junior High has been a success from the first day; no doubt it will make a permanent place for itself in the Weare school system. The following named schools have no pupils in grades 7 and 8 this year: North Weare, Center, Rockland, Friends, Riverdale and South Weare Store School.

You will note, from the statistical tables for the current year, the number of pupils enrolled in each school. Since these figures were compiled, the River Road School has lost 2 pupils. The present outlook is for only 5 pupils for next year. This number is far too small for efficient organization of the school. This community is further handicapped by being unable to provide a suitable boarding place for the teacher. The cost per pupil in a school like this is much more than similar costs in other parts of the town. While I am fully acquainted with the difficulties involved, I nevertheless recommend, that the River Road School be closed and the pupils be assigned to the Riverdale School.

In October, of the current school year, a one day rural Teachers' Institute, under the auspices of the State Board of Education, was held at the South Weare Hall. Teachers were present from Weare, Deering, New Boston, Hopkinton, Henniker, Dunbarton and Goffstown. A committee, headed by Allen Sawyer, had charge of local arrangements and served an excellent dinner to the visiting speakers and teachers. It seems as if meetings of this kind are, not only helpful to the teachers, but must be of considerable help in many ways to the entertaining community. I hope meetings of a similar nature may be held in other sections of the Town at some future date.

Under the present plan of State wide supervision of schools, Weare is in a union with Hopkinton, Henniker and Dunbarton. Schools, teachers and pupils are distributed as follows:

Hopkinton has 14 schools, 18 teachers and 285 pupils.

One teacher has music only.

Henniker has 9 schools, 13 teachers and 251 pupils. One teacher has music only.

Weare has 13 schools, 15 teachers and 236 pupils.

Dunbarton has 5 schools, 5 teachers and 78 pupils.

A total of 41 schools, 51 teachers and 850 pupils.

During the past five years Hopkinton has added two schools; Henniker has closed one and put in an extra teacher in the High School; Weare has added five; thus making a net increase in the supervisory union, of six schools and seven teachers.

In closing, I wish to express appreciation for the whole-hearted coöperation of officials, parents, teachers and pupils, which made the work both pleasant and successful.
