Again our list of schools and teachers remains unchanged from the previous year.

This year the District votes on the question of allowing the School Board to enter into high school tuition contracts with the above districts and academies, in order to permit the payment of the rate charged, which is above the minimum that the district is compelled to pay by law. The legal rate in the absence of a contract is an amount not greater than the average

cost of instruction (items including teachers' salaries. textbooks, scholars' supplies, flags, etc. but not administration, maintenance, or fixed charges) for high schools in the state for the previous year, and not greater than the per pupil cost for the same items in the high school making the charge. The tuition rate in high schools to which Barrington is sending pupils averages \$90 per year. For the present year, the vote of the District will determine whether \$360.81 in tuition is to be paid by the district or by the 20 heads of families whose children are attending high school. These high schools did not charge the legal maximum when costs were high; consequently now that costs have sunk low on account of the depression, they feel that they are justified in maintaining a reasonable rate of tuition. As a matter of fact, the total cost per pupil (including repairs, maintenance, etc.) in these high schools is on the average higher than their average tuition rate.

Any long-term planning in Barrington should consider the advisability of consolidating all the one-room schools (possibly excepting Pond Hill) in a new building at East Barrington. One teacher less would be needed, and better work could be done, each teacher having not over three grades instead of eight as at present. Under the PWA, building projects are being financed on a basis of one-third outright grant and two-thirds federal loan.

The Oak Hill School needs enlargement of the window area on the lower side. At Pond Hill, the shed should be connected with the schoolhouse, with entrances into the schoolroom.

The people of Barrington were very much grieved to hear of the sudden death of Professor Justin O. Wellman, formerly Superintendent of Schools in this district. Under Dr. Wellman the schools of Barrington took a great step forward. His vision reached farther than we have yet attained. His life reminds us that the highest goal of all education is the cultivation of noble character.
