Report of School Board

The results of our schools, with one or two exceptions, are very much the same as those of previous years. We have purchased Tarbell's Lessons in Language, Book II, for advanced classes and introduced a few Wentworth's arithmetics for the younger pupils. We also made a complete change in the spellers which had been in use since the town first furnished books and were badly worn. To get the best results with so limited amount of school money surely requires the modern rules which the latest books contain.

The returns of the truant officer give the number of children, between the ages of five and sixteen, as fifty-two, twenty-four boys and twenty-eight girls.
