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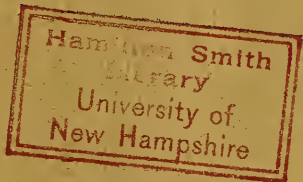

TOWN WARRANT

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- Section A. Town officers' salaries.
B. Town officers' expenses.
C. Election and registration.
D. Municipal court.
E. Town Hall and office expense.
F. Damage and legal expense.
G. Police department.
H. Fire department.
I. White Pine Blister Rust.
J. Health department.
K. Vital Statistics.
L. Memorial Hospital.
M. Town maintenance of highways (summer).
N. Town maintenance of highways (winter).
O. Libraries.
P. Town poor.
Q. Old Age assistance.
R. Memorial Day.
S. Soldiers' aid.
T. Parks and playgrounds.
U. Interest.
V. State tax.
W. County tax.

Art. 3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds of the Town to an amount not exceeding \$37,000, for the purpose of refunding out-

standing indebtedness of a like amount, as authorized by Chapter 48 of the Laws of 1935.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of \$60,000, if needed.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds during the present fiscal year.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town, a sufficient sum of money to obtain Federal aid on any project for which application may be made.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be used with the State appropriation of \$6,000.00 for construction of the Eaton Road.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$807.45 to obtain State aid to be used on Class V highways.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) to improve and tarvia the highway begining at a point near the Railroad Depot at Intervale and ending at the end of said highway at a point near the house owned by Guy W. Saunders, agreeable to a petition signed by Fred W. Dinsmore and others.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars to prepare and tar Green Stone Street in Redstone, which measures about Six hundred (600) feet, and serves ten houses, agreeable to a petition signed by Thomas Hunter and others.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to resurface and tar the road from the junction of Davis Hill Road at Center Conway, to the junction of the Scribner and Gibson Cot-

tage Road near Page Brook, a distance of about 2-5 of one mile, agreeable to a petition signed by John I. Fuller and others.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$80.00) Eighty dollars to maintain the Memorial Park in Redstone, agreeable to a petition signed by C. Stuart McLellan and others.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$500.00) Five hundred dollars for weekly Band Concerts during the months of July and August, by the Conway Band, under the supervision of the Selectmen, agreeable to a petition signed by P. J. Littlefield and others.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tarvia the so-called Allard Hill Road from the junction of the roads near the home of Frank Dolloff to the Madison Town line near the home of John Banfill, agreeable to a petition signed by John S. Banfill and others.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$500.00) Five hundred dollars to surface and tarvia Pine Street from the Episcopal Church to Mechanic Street, agreeable to a petition signed by Harry D. Bunker and others.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to lay out a highway in North Conway village, beginning on the South side of Pine Street at or near the corner of building owned by Harry Bunker, and running Easterly to and across land of J. H. Eastman, to Elbridge Dinsmore's house, said road to be laid out over the old right of way, a width not to exceed eleven feet, agreeable to a petition signed by J. H. Eastman and others.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or appropriate and hire to prepare and tarvia Artist Falls Road from its junction with East Side State Road to the Forest Glen Inn, agreeable to a petition signed by E. J. Ashnault and others.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Ross Snow Plow for use in the North end of the Town, and raise and appropriate the sum of Four hundred (\$400.00) dollars for same, agreeable to a petition signed by R. N. Davis and others.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to buy a small plow to be used to plow the roads from Smith guide post to Chatham line, agreeable to a petition signed by J. H. Woodward and others.

Art. 22. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The measuring stick used to record the value of our libraries is the circulation of its books and magazines. A

glance at the statistics printed below shows that the service of the Conway Public Library is appreciably multiplying.

The increase in the library service and the events that have been of interest to its patrons are the result of the efficient work of the librarian, Miss Pollard. This year the library program included: The Self Improved Reading Course, supervised by the Home Demonstration Agent, Miss Alice Melindy; Water Color Exhibit by W. J. Leitch; Exhibit of Wooden Hobbies; Traveling Book Exhibit; July 8-20, the 15th N. H. Summer Library School; September 24, Neighborhood Meeting of Carroll County Librarians; November 18-23, Children's Book Week.

The Summer Library School was an event of state-wide interest, 16 full-time and 5 part-time students were enrolled from 18 towns. The Neighborhood Meeting was attended by 21 people from 6 towns. The Exhibit of Wooden Hobbies proved to be the most popular exhibit that the Library has sponsored.

The acquisition to good books is the first essential of creating and maintaining a progressive library. Valuable contributions of books from Mr. S. W. Norwood and the club women of Center Conway have helped the Center Conway Free Public Library give a better service to its patrons. Mr. Clarence E. Eastman, the Conway Woman's Club, Mrs. Ruth B. D. Horne and Mrs. Louise W. Potter have given valuable books to the Conway Public Library.

It was necessary this year to spend considerable money for repairs on the building at Conway. The floors in the

Reading Room and the Main Hall were refinished, and work was done on the roof and chimney. At the Center Conway Free Public Library the floor was repainted.

The public libraries of Conway have used to advantage the money that has been allotted to them, and they have gained a creditable rating among the libraries of New Hampshire. The maintenance of a progressive library service is an important unit of our government, and the citizens of Conway possess in their libraries a power of immeasurable value.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

A very important duty of the school board is the preparation of the budget. Our budget for next year has been made on the basis of experience and knowledge of the requirements of the situation. No exactitude can be

claimed for any budget made at this time for a fiscal year ending June 30, 1937.

Economy is not, however, entirely a matter of budget making. Economy depends upon careful administration in the up-keep of property, and the securing of adequate educational opportunity at the lowest cost consistent with reasonable standards of service.

The following table shows an increase in number of pupils and a decreased per capita cost in a six-year period.

It will be noted that the registration for the current year is 47 more than in 1930. The per capita cost in 1930 was \$86 and last year was \$70. No difference is made here between elementary and high school per pupil costs but both are taken together.

The median per pupil cost in the state last year for elementary pupils was \$76. In Conway it was \$60. The high school per capita cost in the state was \$99 and in Conway it was \$109. In comparing high school costs however it should be noted that many districts do not have the added expense of high school transportation.

In the matter of teachers' salaries these comparisons are of interest.

The averages for the state are for the year ending last June and the averages for Conway are for the current year.

The proper up-keep of buildings of an estimated value of about \$150,000 requires considerable annual expenditure. A sum for minor repairs adequate for routine expenses is made in the regular budget, but does not include expense of painting, roofing and replacement of outworn equipment. Last year an appropriation of \$1250 was made for special repairs. This has been expended principally on these items: outside painting on north side of high school and inside painting of three rooms, a roofing job at North Conway, and a general renovation of the building at Redstone and of the primary room at Center Conway. A considerable amount of work was done sanding and dressing seats and furniture at the high school, at Redstone and at Center Conway. A suitable sanding machine has been acquired by the district and this work will be continued during the summer vacations.

The services of a music teacher and supervisor were secured this year and music has been taught in all schools including the high school. This service should be continued and the salary of a music teacher is included in the budget.

The burden of school support falls entirely upon property taxes. Other governmental activities and public services are financed wholly or in large part by ingenious systems of indirect taxation. The maintenance of good schools therefore demands faith and courage on the part of those who wish to give our children an adequate preparation for life. Each period of depression through which our country has passed has revealed the weakness of the prevailing method of school support. The property tax from which our schools derive most of their revenue has proved inadequate and unfair in every crisis. We should therefore demand larger equalization funds built up from some of these sources of indirect taxation for the relief

of the local burden of school support. The present system is unfair.

We wish to express our appreciation and thanks to Mr. C. I. Nash and the dissolved Livermore district for the gift of a motion picture machine, a post card projector and several pieces of school furniture.

Detailed information concerning Kennett High school will be found in a report by Headmaster E. W. McKeen which is being printed as a part of this report.

My thanks are due to the school board, the teachers and parents and citizens for their cooperation and help.
