THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for George Gamble Library.

6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes.

8. To see what action the town will take in regard to shingling Town Hall and repair Tractor House, and raise money for same.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply on Trunk Line Construction bond.

10. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid of \$500, and raise \$232.50 for same to be expended on North Road so called.

11. (Legislation pending) To see if the town will vote to raise \$465 and receive \$1,000 from the State for State Aid Construction to be expended on North Road, so called, or town to raise \$465 and receive from State \$2,644.22 for Town Road Maintenance to be expended similar to emergency relief funds as in 1933 and 1934.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

One hundred and fifty-five books have been added to the library, partly bought by the trustees, some donated and others sent by the State Library Commission. Almost half of our patrons are children and for that reason one-third of our appropriation is spent for juvenile books.
