# Fire Warden's Report

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Forest Fire Wardens for the town of Harts Location hereby submit the following report:

In the year of 1929 there were two fires, fortunately causing the town no expense. One was on the road front—set by tourists; the area burned was 1-4 of acre. Second was on government land; the burden of the expense was borne by them. Four volunteers from the forest fire organization of Harts Location assisted the government men, holding the fire to an area of an acre. This was set by lightning.
