

# The State of New Hampshire

- To the inhabitants of the town of Milton in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:
- 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Officers, and vote on the question of allowing baseball to be played on Sunday in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 155, law of 1931.
- 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for Sidewalk construction and repair in Milton Village and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 4. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for breaking roads the coming winter, raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to pay for the same and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended on the highway leading

from the Town House toward "New Bridge" (so called), and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Mills Village to Wakefield town line, known as the Jug Hill Road, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the provisions of Chapter 35, laws of 1905, and amendments thereto, the joint sum to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Village, past the Nute High School, to Farmington town line.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 9. To see what salary the town will vote to pay the First and Second Engineers and Firemen in addition to the amount allowed by law; to see how much per hour the town will vote to pay the Engineers and Firemen while fighting fires, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to, and appoint a committee of three to work in conjunction with the Selectmen, to investigate the various offices of the town, adjust and fix all salaries and wages of all town officers and employees.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of street lights the ensuing year.

- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for the benefit of the Free Public Library at Milton Mills and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) for Memorial Day expenses.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the town a sum of money necessary for the current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1933 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town charges and expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for improvements and maintenance of the lots in front of the station and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300) to receive an appropriation from the State, the joint sum to be expended on the road leading from Farmington to Middleton in said town.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to purchase a tractor and snowplow to be used on the West Milton and Milton Village highways, raise and appropriate or hire upon notes of the town an amount of money necessary to pay for said tractor and snowplow and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

- 19. To see if the voters of the town think it advisable to use the stone crusher in obtaining material for the highways.
- 20. By petition of George Tanner and eighteen others: To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money, not exceeding twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200) for the purchase of a road machine or a so called grader, to choose the necessary committee and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 21. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell to the Oscar G. Morehouse Post, No. 61, American Legion, the four lots namely Hart, Knox, Durgin and Jones located at the corner of Church Street, and East Side Highway Milton Village, for the sum of one dollar and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the tramp lobby and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to accept a bequest under the will of the late Robert Miller Looney, and if so to determine what shall be done with the property and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to purchase the property of the Milton Fire Precinct, raise and appropriate the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) to pay for the same.
- 26. By petition of Fred McGregor and sixteen others: To determine the salaries, wages, compensations, and allowances of all persons serving the town.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### FINANCIAL

Our budget for the ensuing year shows a reduction of \$1,789 in the estimated cost of running the elementary schools and meeting other statutory requirements. However, the estimated income of the district, not raised by taxation, is greatly reduced for several reasons.

First—the substantial balance which was in the treasury a year ago will be nearly exhausted to meet the demands of the present school year. Second—our state aid for next year will be only about one-half the amount which we receive this year. This is due to the fact that the "five dollar tax" is larger this year owing to the increased equalized valuation of the district. Third—the income from the local trust funds is less than in former years. Our receipts from this source was over two hundred dollars less this year than we had anticipated.

As a result of these three losses in revenue the total assessment required to balance the budget for the elementary schools will be about fifty dollars more than last year. However, we are asking for one hundred dollars less for general repairs to offset this.

The report of the headmaster of Nute High School and the report of the school nurse will follow.

# REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

To the Superintendent of Schools and the Members of the Board of Trustees:

The forty-second year of this institution opened September 5 with an enrollment of seventy-nine pupils. Transfers to other schools and withdrawals reduced the registration until at present there are 69 pupils divided as follows: Seniors, 12; Juniors, 9; Sophomores, 18; Freshmen, 30. There are eleven tuition pupils as compared with twenty-four last year.

Reports from the State Department of Education show an increased rating by the Commissioner on the scholastic standard of the school over that of previous years.

The Otis Group Intelligence Scale given all members of the school showed an increase of from five to ten points on a like performance given last year, showing a mastering of fundamental processes.

The Woody Arithmetic Scale to determine efficiency in mathematics showed a marked difficulty on the part of all to handle fractions, the result showing the Seniors 87% perfect, Juniors 83%, Sophomores 82% and Freshmen 84%.

There has been a trend towards increase in those registering in the Classical Course this year, eight freshmen electing the Latin or College preparatory course as compared with three last year.

Realizing the value of visual education, field trips have been made by the various classes, the Senior United States Government group going to Concord for a day and attending the Legislature, Federal court, States Prison, Historical society and other places of interest. The Commercial department has visited a modern office and seen up-to-date office equipment being used. Physiography class students visit nearby places to witness effects of water and glacial erosion.

Athletics have been self supporting, and furnished a surplus for purchasing of a ten volume set of Standard History of the World for general reference and research work. It has also furnished money for many needed improvements about school including a new gravel road, a first aid and emergency room for girls which has been furnished with a couch, dressers, table and chairs. As a matter of safety a concrete slab has been poured to cover the unused well back of the school. Shrubbery set out by the graduating class of 1932 has been fertilized and cared for and has made good growth.

Several outstanding booklets, papers and projects of work have been completed. A reproduction of "The House of Seven Gables," a carpenter job worthy of a master builder, is exhibited by Constandino DiPrizio, sophomore honor pupil from Middleton.

Attendance has been excellent and to date but five tardy marks are charged against the school showing an aptitude for promptness hitherto not exhibited.

The excellent condition of the school property is due in a large measure to the untiring efforts of Caretaker Tetherly, whose personal interest is highly commendable.
