THE TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the eight day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 P. M. to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for interest on same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,050.00 for the Northwood Public Libraries.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,525.00 for Recreation, Parks, and Playgrounds.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Band Concerts. (Article inserted by Budget Committee)
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for care of the cemeteries.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Highways.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$626.02 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$4,173.46.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 in addition to the joint T.R.A. fund.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$380.00 for the Concord Hospital.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum \$4,526.25 to pay one of two notes, together with interest charges thereon, for the new fire truck purchased in 1965.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of Pine Blister Rust.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used, at the discretion of the Selectmen, to support the work of the State Cancer Commission.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept as Town-Road the right-of-way known as Harvey Road, leading from the State Highway (Rt. 202-4-9) into Harvey Lake Estates and ending at Elm Street so-called, being approximately 40 feet wide and 2,665 feet long as shown on plan of Harvey Lake Estates prepared by the Northwood Development Corporation. - 16. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

REPORT OF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Northwood Volunteer Fire Department answered 41 calls in 1965. 28 of these calls were in the Town of Northwood and the other 13 calls were for assistance to our neighboring towns. The nature of the calls in Northwood were as follows: 2 chimney fires, 4 building fires, 12 grass and brush fires, 7 calls to town dump, 1 for assistance at an auto accident, and 2 calls for assistance in near drownings. The out-of-town calls were: 1 building fire, 11 brush and grass fires, and 1 call for help with gas leaking from an electric refrigerator.

In August of this year, the new fire truck, a 500 gallon per minute pumper, was delivered to the Town from the Howe Fire Apparatus Company of Anderson, Indiana. This truck was purchased by the Town to replace the 1939 pumper which was housed at the Narrows firehouse. Also added to the Department this year was a 1958 International 1500 gallon tank truck. This unit, equipped with foam which is very essential in fighting gasoline or oil fires, was made available to the Town by the Northwood Volunteer Fire Department. It was purchased and equipped from the Department's own funds for approximately \$1200. Another improvement this year was a 1000 gallon tank donated to the Department by the Northwood Garage. This tank replaced the 800 gallon tank on one of our trucks, giving us 200 gallons more capacity on this unit.

The Department now has three tank trucks and two pumpers which can carry to a fire a combined total of approximately 4600 gallons of water. Also donated to the Department this year was a 300 gallon per minute portable pump which has been mounted on a trailer and will be ready for use in the near future. This pump will be of great value to the Department as it can be placed at a source of water that the trucks might not be able to reach. When complete, this unit will carry

hose and other fire fighting equipment. In the near future, the Department is planning to purchase, from its own funds, more equipment to add to these trucks, such as Scott Air Packs, dry chemical fire extinguishers and a resuscitator.

Remember — a permit is required for any outdoor fire unless the ground is covered with snow. Anyone wishing to do any type of outdoor burning should now obtain a permit from Charles Nutter, the new fire warden for the Town of Northwood.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

We Must All Be Careful:

- 1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 p.m.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

Among his many duties, Mr. Houghton will continue to assist in supervision, coordinate the curriculum, recruit teachers and to give professional advice to the teachers and administrators. Mr. Houghton has had ten years experience as a superintendent in Maine and should be valuable to your school.

In conclusion, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation given to us during the year by the citizens, school board, faculty and pupils of Northwood.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

Northwood

To the Superintendent of Schools:

During the school year of 1964-65, as part of the school health service, all the pupils in the Northwood Elementary School have had health inspections. These included checking height, weight, vision, teeth and tonsils. Those children in grades I, III, V, and VII have had their hearing tested, also, as have all pupils with a known hearing problem or a history of ear trouble.

Whenever defects were found, the parents were notified either by a home call or a letter. Parents have been very cooperative in having defects corrected as is shown by the following summary of tests, defects and corrections:

A Pre-School Clinic was held May 21, 1965. It was attended by 25 children, and each received a routine health inspection by the school nurse.

A Dental Clinic, co-sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Dental Health, the Northwood-Harvey Lake Women's Club and the Northwood Parent-Teachers Association was held in March and April 1965. This provided for a thorough cleaning of the teeth followed by an application of fluoride solution. (Dental research has

shown this to be a worthwhile aid to reducing tooth decay.) A total of 198 children were screened by the hygienist, and 163 children received treatment. This is a very big step toward improving the overall dental health of Northwood's children, and another clinic is planned for 1965-66. It is to be hoped that this will become a regular part of the school health program.

The school was hit quite hard by outbreaks of various communicable and infectious diseases. Cases reported included those listed here:

During the school year three children were seen at the Portsmouth Rehabilitation Center, and one at the orthopedic clinic of the New Hampshire Crippled Children's Services.

A total of 41 home visits were made.
