THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Rumney in the county of Grafton in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To shoose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways in addition to the amount required by law.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of library.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day and choose a committee to expend the same.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Common.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500 to secure \$4,500 from the state for trunk line construction.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$817.75 to secure \$1,635.51 from the state for state aid maintenance.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,291.33 to secure \$4,582.67 from the state for trunk line maintenance.

12. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 87, section 1, of the Revised Statutes on a section of the Moosilauke Road so called and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of \$100 for this purpose.

13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a certain amount of money to be expended on a permanent piece of road to Stinson Lake and how much.

14. To see what action the town will take in regard to the White Pine Blister Rust and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all taxes paid before July first.

16. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory blanks distributed at the time of taking appraisal of property.

17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of uncollected taxes.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for paint on outside of and other repairs on Town Hall, and if so how much.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

We have installed a jacketed heater in the Montview building, which makes the room more comfortable and more healthful by creating a better ventilation. We have had the underpinning repaired at the Depot school building so that it has been much more comfortable during the winter.

The front part of the Depot building is sinking and needs attention, also the roof needs shingling during the coming year. We have suggested the amount needed for that and other repairs under the head of MINOR REPAIRS AND EXPENSES in the financial table above.
