School Report.

In January our schools closed with a school year of twenty-eight weeks. As the great mass of boys and girls now finish their schooling in the lower grades, much more schooling than this amount is needed.

We were fortunate in having our teachers graduates of High Schools and of the State Normal School. Pupils completed the studies of Arithmetic and Algebra, also English History and Latin were taken up to good advantage.

The pupil of the small school lacks that emulation and competition so essential to progress which will be afforded by contact with a larger number of children. Again the words of our State Superintendent can be heeded. "If a rural school has twenty-five pupils, a competent teacher can be economically employed. In a good community such a school has the advantages not possessed by village or city schools."
