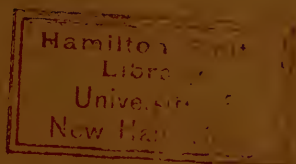

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said state, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see what sum of money in addition to that required by law the Town will raise for repair of roads and bridges.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Winter Roads.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the poor.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay interest and apply on Town debt.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept Highway State Aid and make appropriation for same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to have the dust laid in the streets of West Stewartstown and Riverside and make appropriation for same.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

This, my first year as Superintendent of your schools, has to be of necessity a period of becoming acquainted and adjusted to the present condition and needs of your school system. During this period I have been greatly helped by the close cooperation of School Board and teachers. I feel that I am now gradually becoming acquainted with your schools and pupils and know something of what has been done in the past and the objectives of the future.

Since the opening of schools in September 1927 I have made a total of 128 visits of supervision and inspection in the various schools of the town. Classes in all subjects have been heard, standard tests given and various needs of individual pupils have been looked after. In certain of the outlying schools pupils still seem somewhat deficient in reading and special stress has been laid on this part of the work for those pupils. It is hoped that by the end of the year some improvement may be shown.

During the last complete school year the schools were all in session for 359 half days with attendance of 92 percent. The percentage of attendance shows a slight improvement over the previous year and it is hoped that we shall not fall below the mark this year. Punctuality and regular habits of attendance are valuable not only in school life, but still more so in later life.

The objectives mentioned by your former Superintendent in the report of last year are still kept in mind and the schools are still working towards those ends.

The State Aid which Stewartstown receives each year is a very considerable sum—amounting as it does to around \$6,000. In order to insure the town in receiving the full amount each year it is necessary that school buildings be kept fairly near standards as respects lighting, heating and sanitary conditions.

This year the School Board is asking for an increased appropriation for repairs and alterations in order to make certain school buildings nearer the required standards. We have in mind particularly changing the toilets at North Hill and Hollow Schools so that they will be in connection with the main building; a new floor at North Hill, and painting and some general repairs inside and outside at West Stewartstown.

It will be noted that the total of necessary items in budget as estimated by the Board for 1928-29 total somewhat lower than last year.
