#### Dear Fellow Citizens:

Another year has gone by and, all in all, it has been another good year. But first, as you know, at last Town Meeting, Mr. Walfred G. Wiklund chose not to run again as Selectman after giving the Town some years of excellent service because of his long experience in the field of business. He was most diligent, conscientious and helpful in the conduct of his duties and we were very sorry to see him leave the Board.

As has been the case for some years now, the Town was again able to come up with an operating surplus, \$2,072.27, which we are asking, in Article 10, to be voted into the capital reserve fund as has been customary. There were the usual surprise expenditures, which can never be anticipated when one is trying to budget as far in advance as we have to, and one of the biggest surprises was the very bad spring washout on the Gilsum Road, necessitating a lot of work there which ran the highway account over by a slight amount for the first time in many years. We feel the Highway Department continues to do an excellent job and the recent "worst storm in ten years" was an example when, with one piece of equipment broken down, the old tractor, the Town was, neverthe less, completely opened up for some kind of traffic days before some other larger Cheshire County towns had some roads open at all.

While on the subject of tractors, the value of a capital reserve fund becomes apparent. The tractor-plow has been owned by the Town for 32 years and was at least a few years old at the time of purchase. Because of the age, as of this writing, there is no idea whether replacement parts can be gotten, another piece of equipment may have to be purchased. The type of recent storm we had, with the extreme drifting, made an extra piece of equipment extremely valuable in getting roads open early because of the slow going and backtracking through drifts.

The surplus mentioned above was accomplished even though we squeezed out funds from other appropriations in the amount of \$650. to buy a V-plow to go on the grader we purchased at the end of last year. The company, from whom we purchased the grader, loaned us one but had to recall it hurriedly because of a sale, and we were able to pick up locally one well-suited to our needs at a much better price. The grader, by the way, has given excellent service with a large fuel saving of diesel over gasoline.

The T.R.A. Project on Gilsum Road had to be stopped before anticipated because of the early onset of winter, and we saved a good deal of interest money by demanding the State return to us the unused portion of the funds, \$5,896.75, until such time as it is needed this coming summer or fall on the completion of the Project. Also, as you will note from the Comparative Statement, we have a carryover in the amount of \$1,043.63 to add to this year's Class V money because of projects which could not be finished this past year. This, however, was earmarked, as you will also note, and is not included in the operating surplus any more than the amount of the sale of the pump by the Fire Department.

So, here's looking forward to a good Town Meeting and another successful year of operation.

#### ARTICLE IV

Voted to raise and appropriate \$4,400 for Winter Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE V

Voted to raise and appropriate \$550.00 for the General Expenses of the Highway Departmetnt.

#### ARTICLE VI

Voted to raise and appropriate \$447.14 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State share of \$2,980.93.

#### ARTICLE VII

Voted to raise and appropriate \$150.00 to supplement funds so as to maintain adequate Public Library service.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Voted to raise and appropriate \$600.00 for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

#### ARTICLE IX

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

#### ARTICLE X

Voted to add to the capital reserve fund \$2,668.69, operating surplus for fiscal year 1967, for the purpose of purchasing new highway equipment, designating the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established.

#### ARTICLE XI

Voted to accept a new Cemetery Trust Fund in the amount of \$500.00 to be known as the HELENA ALMA DAVIS and the BERTHA THRUN MEMORIAL FUND.

#### ARTICLE XII

The whole number of votes cast was 69. Not for the article as written, 27 no. For the article as written, 42 yes. The yes vote having a majority of all the votes given in was by the Moderator declared passed as written.

#### ARTICLE XIII

Voted to accept Article XIII as it is written.

#### ARTICLE XIV

Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

#### ARTICLE XV

There was a discussion about the Dog Ordinance that was voted at the Public Meeting held January 31, 1968, at the Community Hall.

It was suggested that Harvey Swett, David Clark and Carleton Nims serve on the Sullivan Building Code and Zoning Ordinance Study Committee.

A suggestion was made that the Selectmen look into the possibility of widening the hill on the South Road.

Anyone who would like to attend the Selectmen's meetings is welcome.

Voted the meeting be dissolved.

## TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

Your are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at 7:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as be judged necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money, including that sum required by law, as may be judged necessary, for Summer Maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any construction of the same, for the ensuing year.

4. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the Winter Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the General Expenses of the Highway Department.

6. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$444.43 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State share of \$2,962.88.

7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service or to supplement funds otherwise provided.

8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

9. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to add to the capital reserve fund, for the purpose of purchasing new highway equipment, the amount of \$2,072.27, and \$200.00 for the purpose of purchasing Fire Department equipment, the first being the operating surplus of the fiscal year 1968 and the second being derived from the sale of old Fire Department equipment, and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established. 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following trust funds from the Estate of Ruth Nims Benware:

- a. "For the care and preservation of the family lot of my Grandfather, Joseph Nims, in the Sullivan Cemetery, the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.)"
- b. "For the care and preservation of the family burial lot of my Father, Edwin F. Nims, in the said Sullivan Cemetery, the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.)"

12. To see if the Town will vote to revise the Town officers' and Town employees' salaries or take any action thereon.

13. To see if the Town will vote to hold Town Meeting at 9:00 A.M. or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to purchase police radios or take any action thereon. (By petition)

15. To see if the Town will vote to restrain dogs from running at large or take any action thereon.

16. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town reappraised by outside appraisers and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action thereon.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to support the services of the Community Mental Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, said services operating upder the provisions of the Community Mental Health Services Act of New Hampshire, with State Grant-In-Aid. (By petition)

18. To accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

19. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of town affairs for the ensuing year.
